Making it count with heritage grant

Whanganui's heritage buildings have received a boost with an increase in Whanganui District Council's Heritage Grant Fund.

The funding pool has increased from \$100,000 annually to \$250,000 annually, and the scope of the funding criteria has widened.

Owners of heritage buildings can now apply for funding support for professional services relating to seismic design and fire upgrades, and funding can be sought for council and Crown-owned buildings that are in community use, as well as privately owned buildings outside the central city subject to demonstrating substantial community benefit.

The Doyle's Accounting building at 32 Taupo Quay – one the oldest in the Old Town area – is the latest recipient of funding. It was built as the *Whanganui Chronicle's* headquarters in 1896 and served this purpose until the newspaper moved to larger new premises in 1912 on the corner of Rutland Street and Drews Avenue.

While the building was unsympathetically altered in 1954, the original sash windows were retained. Incentive funding was granted towards their careful repainting as they are rare examples of pre-1900 joinery at the heart of Whanganui's Old Town precinct.

Kowhai Park's flying fox is up and running for summer

The flying fox at Kowhai Park (pictured) has reopened to the community. The ground around the structure that was previously saturated has dried out enough to let people use the flying fox. The previous flying fox was taken down in October 2020 because of safety concerns. The new ride has now been brought up to current safety standards with the safety zone widened and improvements made to the launch zone. Contractors will return at a later date to finish the tidy-up of the site.

Durie Hill elevator / Winter Gardens

- The 102-year-old Durie Hill elevator has reopened to the public after the completion of repairs to its DC motor. The elevator operates from 8.00am–6.00pm, Monday to Friday, and from 10.00am–5.00pm on Saturday, Sunday and public holidays.

- The Winter Gardens at Rotokawau Virginia Lake have reopened to visitors. The gardens have been closed since July while upgrade work took place and are open daily from 9.00am to 5.00pm. **Please note:** There is still some work taking place on the gardens.

Somme Pde road works

Gloucester / Lowther streets area

Work to prepare and seal the road on Somme Parade between Gloucester and Lowther streets started earlier this week and is expected to be completed this **Friday, 12 November 2021**.

Stop-go traffic management is in place and delays are likely. Glasgow Street is advised as an alternative route to avoid the worksite.

Traffic signal upgrade

Victoria Ave / Guyton St intersection

Work has begun on an upgrade to traffic signal equipment at the Victoria Avenue / Guyton Street intersection. During the upgrade, Victoria Avenue traffic will have right of way, while give way signs will be in place for Guyton Street traffic (right-turning traffic to give way to opposing traffic).

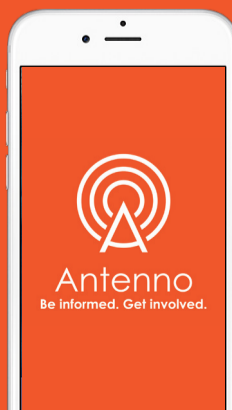
