

London St shared pathway rolls on

Work on the final section of the London Street shared pathway has started. The 100-metre section will complete the shared pathway link along London Street to the bottom of St John's Hill (Great North Road). It will also join with the top end of Te Tuaiwi shared pathway that begins at Whanganui City Bridge and continues through the central city to London Street.

The construction, overseen by Whanganui Alliance a collaboration between Whanganui District Council and Downer NZ – includes a 100m-long, 2.5m high concrete retaining wall (artist's impression right) opposite the Z Energy service station between Fergusson Street and the Whanganui SPCA site.

Once fully completed, the London Street shared pathway will make it safer and easier to travel to the Splash Centre and Springvale Bike Park, as well as providing safer routes for students cycling to schools in the area.



The work is expected to be completed in late February 2021. Shared pathways are routes designated for shared use by people who are cycling, scootering, skating or walking. Stage one of the London Street shared pathway – a 3m-wide concrete shared pathway running from the Splash Centre to Fergusson Street – was completed last year.
