

Survey will gauge our 'digital pulse'

Whanganui District Council wants to hear about internet access and the level of digital confidence in the Whanganui District. A community survey will be available online, in paper form and via phone call from 12 noon tomorrow, Thursday, 13 January 2022.

The survey is to help the council better understand the current state of online access and services throughout our district.

The council's Connected Community Advisor, Jo Buckingham, says, "As we implement the council's digital strategy, this information will help us gauge the need for improvements to digital access or support in our libraries and community organisations. We can then look to attract national funding for digital inclusion initiatives."

Jo Buckingham says everyone in the Whanganui district is encouraged to complete the survey and help others to do so. "It's not just for those who use the internet regularly,"

"For those people who do not use the internet there will be opportunities to participate by paper, at events or by phone. Council staff and volunteers will also be doing mail drops in some suburbs and door knocking to help people complete the survey and make sure that a wide range of people are enabled to participate.

Pine trees on Ridgway St to be removed next week



Whanganui District Council will remove pine trees alongside the Heads Road cemetery on Ridgway Street next week as part of its planned maintenance schedule.

Council parks officer, Claire Lilley, says, "The majority of these pine trees have long weighty limbs and branches. This poor form means they are at risk of breaking or toppling."

The pine trees (pictured above) stand along the cemetery's Ridgway Street boundary and over the years have become a local feature. "While these trees are not listed as protected, we appreciate that they will have provided shade for Cemetery Circuit spectators, and visitors to the cemetery, for many years," Claire Lilley says.

The council manages more than 6000 street trees and 10,000 surveyed parks and reserve trees. Claire Lilley says, "The council's priority is maintaining our open spaces and keeping them as safe as possible. We have an obligation to ensure that we manage risks to public safety from trees at risk of falling."

The work to remove the trees will begin on Monday, 17 January 2022 and is expected to take about a week. During this time the road will be closed in the immediate work vicinity with traffic diversions and signs in place.

Once the trees are removed, the bank will be replanted with native plant species and planting will be complete by



"It is important that the survey shows both the good and not so good stories of people's digital journeys in the community," Jo Buckingham says.
