The council wants to connect with people throughout April and is encouraging submissions to the draft plan.

Feedback is wanted on four important issues for Whanganui: the Whanganui velodrome project, youth places and spaces development, the Davis Library extension and development and implementation of a coastal plan. Submissions close at 5.00pm on Friday, 30 April 2021.

## Pensioner housing pet trial

Whanganui District Council is seeking community feedback on proposed changes to its Pensioner Housing Policy. Central to the changes is a trial allowing council tenants to keep pets. When surveyed last year, most residents were positive about being able to keep pets, mainly birds or cats. Tenants were generally not in favour of allowing dogs.

The council considers the wellbeing of tenants a priority. It is recommending a one-year trial for pets at its Eugene Crotty, Walter Nash and 22 Puriri Street pensioner housing complexes. Residents will be able to keep fish, birds or a cat at these facilities during the proposed trial period.

Council policy advisor, Will Johnston, says, "Because a lot of our tenants live alone, we believe pets can be very helpful in alleviating any feelings of loneliness residents may have."

If residents would like to have a pet during the trial period they will need to sign a pet care agreement accepting responsibility for their animal's care and wellbeing, along with any damage the pet might cause to their unit.
