Awards put spotlight on Whanganui!

Whanganui's winter celebration and light parade, Lights on Bikes and Drews Ave Street Party, scored the Outstanding Event award at Recreation Aotearoa Te Whai Oranga's New Zealand Recreation Awards 2022 held in Nelson on 24 November.



Lights on Bikes celebrates lit-up bikes, skateboards, prams, wheelchairs and other wheeled contraptions that travel from Drews Avenue, through Pākaitore Moutoa Gardens, along the Whanganui River and back.

The cycle route includes a range of illuminated displays by local artists, projections on buildings, a lit-up tram and roving performers. Local musicians and bands were centred at the hub of the street party and a band performed from a balcony. Workshops to make illuminated costumes for people and their bikes were held at the Sarjeant Gallery leading up to the event.

Lights on Bikes has run since 2018. The 2021 event (pictured) was an opportunity to showcase the opening of the Drews Avenue streetscape project co-designed by businesses, Iwi, building owners, artists and residents operating in the street. The upgraded streetscape in Drews Avenue, funded through Waka Kotahi NZ Transport Agency's Innovating Streets programme, features communal outdoor seating surrounded by plantings, bike racks, a retro telephone handset and games for locals and visitors to enjoy.

Wharf demolition underway

concrete foundations of the previous Victory Shed now underway. Jurgens Demolition have been onsite since the beginning of December, with the work expected to take two-to-three weeks to complete.

Whanganui District Council's port project manager, Phil Wardale (pictured above, at left), says the work needed to be completed before Christmas. "Recent assessments have indicated the concrete slabs which were once located under the Victory Shed are slumping and at risk of collapse. It is important that we remove that risk as soon as possible. We are fortunate to have a local business with the capabilities and expertise to undertake the work for us. Jurgens have even procured a specialist demolition attachment so they can complete the demolition promptly and more efficiently, with the most appropriate equipment.

"Demolition will also include further securing of the site to prevent public access. It's important for us to convey that the entire port including this work site is not a safe place for the general public, especially children and no one should be trying to access the area, or swimming into the property and jumping off wharf structures," Phil Wardale says.

Air Chathams has taken over the Whanganui Airport cafe. JARS Cafe will be run by Loulou Krebs (pictured) and her daughter, Lola. Loulou, originally from Wellington, previously taught bakery and cookery at UCOL and worked at Maria Lane Eatery & Bar.



Whanganui District Council supported Air Chathams with the set-up of the in-house cafe through favourable lease terms and a coffee machine. Previously, the cafe was leased to private providers. The in-house cafe will be based on the Whakatane Airport model, which Air Chathams also runs.

Loulou Krebs says the cafe will provide "good, healthy, uncomplicated and delicious" food, with menu items like "tomato on Vogel's bread" for early-morning passengers to start the day. Other menu items include scones and muffins, quiches and sausage rolls, all made in the cafe kitchen. Superfood ingredients and home-made preserves will also be in the mix, as well as great coffee.

The cafe's name is based on Lola's love of jars as well as Loulou's preserves, and jars will be used as serving vessels. JARS Cafe hours are Monday to Friday, 6.00am-11.00am and 3.30pm-5.00pm. Closed on Saturdays, the cafe's Sunday hours are 3.30pm-5.00pm. Hours will be reviewed in the new year.
