Whanganui District Council will be entering Whanganui in the awards' Most Beautiful Small City category this year. We'd like to hear about community-initiated projects that could be included in the entry in the following areas:

- Litter prevention / waste minimisation including cleanups, education and community engagement related to litter
- Community beautification projects including plantings or maintenance of landscaped areas, community murals and heritage restoration
- Improved recycling projects including events, collections, education or community engagement related to recycling
- Sustainable tourism attractions including implementing ecological restoration or waste minimisation initiatives that cater to tourism

• Reducing greenhouse gas emissions including initiatives that seek to reduce greenhouse gas emissions costeffectively, demonstrate leadership on sustainability and climate change, and reduce the environmental impact of government business.

Whanganui District Council is considering implementing a freedom camping bylaw. The proposed bylaw would limit the number of nights freedom campers can stay in several places, limit the number of vehicles that can be freedom camping at any one time in a given area and restrict camping to certified self-contained vehicles where appropriate.

The Kokohuia Wetland sits between Puriri Street and the Whanganui River, behind the Heads Road industrial area. It has long been an important cultural landscape, food source and ecological environment for Whanganui.

Wembley Park

Rabbit control work next week A rabbit control operation will be held at

Wembley Park sports grounds in Whanganui East between 10.00pm and dawn from Monday, 19 July until Friday, 23 July 2021. The entrances to Wembley Park will be staffed during this overnight work to ensure no one enters the site. Signs will also be in place advising the area is closed. Whanganui Police have been required to approve these operations due to the use of firearms in an urban area. Thermal imaging equipment will be used, and firearms will use .22 calibre segmented bullets and be fitted with silencers. The operation is weather dependent and may be postponed if required.
