## Dog registration fees due

Dog registration fees for all dog owners are now due. Pay your fees on or by **Saturday**, **31 July 2021** to receive a prompt payment discount of 10 percent.

Whanganui District Council is also introducing new responsible dog owner criteria from 31 July 2021. If you're a current responsible dog owner and pay your dog registration fees by 31 July, your responsible dog owner status will continue and you'll qualify for the annual dog registration discount. Any dog owner without responsible dog owner status after 31 July will need to meet updated guidelines under the council's new Dog Control Policy 2021.

#### Rates rebate reminder

Ratepayers who may qualify for a rates rebate must apply by **Wednesday, 30 June 2021** for the 2020-21 rating year (the rating year runs from 1 July to 30 June).

If your income is low to moderate (maximum \$26,150) you may be eligible for a rates rebate of up to \$655. To determine whether you are eligible, the council requires your gross income earnings (before tax) for the tax period ending 31 March 2020.

The rates rebate will be calculated on your income earnings and your 2020-21 Whanganui District Council rates and Horizons Regional Council rates. For more information, please contact Whanganui District Council on (06) 349 0001 and ask for the rates team.

# Drews Ave streetscape to make its mark with road art

### Power pole renewal

#### Partial Virginia Rd closure on 23 June

A section of Virginia Road between Porritt Street and Hillside Terrace will be closed to all traffic for the replacement of a power pole next **Wednesday, 23 June 2021 from 8.30am-5.00pm**.

Detour signs will be in place and access to Porritt Street and Hillside Terrace will remain available at all times during the work.

Vehicle access to properties on the affected part of Virginia Road will be permitted during the work when possible - traffic controllers will be onsite to assist residents.

Please note there will be no through access for traffic in Drews Avenue between Taupo Quay and Ridgway Street or in Rutland Street on the above dates. Businesses near the affected area will remain open during the work and will have vehicle access available at all times.
