Lanterns on the Awa 2022 is a community event to celebrate Whanganui's continual support of Chinese and other Asian cultures. This year's event – on **Saturday**,



3 September 2022 from 5.00pm - will once again be held alongside the Whanganui River near the Whanganui River Markets area in Taupo Quay. Whanganui District Council is helping to support this event as part of Whanganui's sister-city relationship with Lijiang in China.

Lanterns on the Awa 2022 will include a stage for performers of traditional dance, music and martial arts, along with traditional Chinese hanging lanterns and the culturally significant gesture of releasing wax-coated floating lanterns (candles) over the Whanganui River. Parking in metered areas

Whanganui District Council's chief executive David Langford says parking fines have not been increased by the council since the introduction of new parking meters in March this year. The fines have always been \$40.00 for parking in metered areas and not paying at all, and they have always been between \$12.00 and \$57.00 for paying for parking and then exceeding the time limit.

"I think a lot of people may not realise that parking infringement fines are set in legislation under the Land Transport (Offences and Penalties) Regulations. The council can't just increase the fines," David Langford says.

"Lately, people have been caught out with a \$40.00 fine when they haven't paid to park because our parking meters are a bit smarter than the older versions. In the past the mixture of old parking meter models made it difficult to properly enforce the \$40.00 infringement fine for failing to pay when they park."
