#### **Heads Rd roadworks**

#### Area between Abbot St and Beach Rd

A section of Heads Road between Abbot Street and Beach Road is being upgraded after years of wear from heavy traffic. Work to replace the rough road surface was scheduled to begin this week with completion expected by late March, weather

The most heavily used sections of the road, which includes a rail crossing, will be reinforced and strengthened. This includes the Abbot Street and Beach Road intersections. KiwiRail has approved the work and will have personnel available to monitor rail signalling. Nearby industries have also

Stop/go traffic management will be in place and the roadway reduced to one lane during the work - traffic delays are possible. At this stage, no road closures are expected.

Rat baiting at Rotokawau Virginia Lake is taking place until Thursday, 1 April 2021.

The rat bait Pestoff has been laid in approved bait stations at the Great North Road end of the lake and signs will be in place for the duration of the operation. Bait stations will be removed before the Easter public holiday.
