

Creative Communities funding opens

Applications are now open for the Creative Communities Scheme, which funds local arts projects that benefit



the community. The Creative Communities Scheme is a partnership between Whanganui District Council and Creative New Zealand, and administered by Whanganui & Partners, the Council's economic development agency.

Anique Jayasinghe, Community Arts Co-ordinator at Whanganui & Partners, says funding is allocated to projects that make a difference to the community by encouraging youth participation in the arts, giving locals the chance to engage with arts activities or showcasing artistic cultural traditions. "We've had some great success stories, including the Ranana Māori Committee's Te Hanga Hīnaki project, which is currently underway," Anique Jayasinghe says.

Applications must be for projects not yet started and will be completed within 12 months of receiving funding – this round is for projects that will take place between 1 November 2020 and 1 November 2021.



Face masks mandatory for Durie Hill lift and on buses



It is now mandatory under COVID-19 Alert Level 2 restrictions for all Durie Hill Elevator users over 12 years of age to wear a face mask or face covering when travelling on the lift. This central Government requirement came into effect on Monday, 31 August 2020.

QR codes will be on display at both ends of the elevator for contact-tracing purposes. Compliance with face coverings in the lift will remain in place until further notice.

The wearing of face masks or face coverings also became compulsory on all public buses in Whanganui on Monday, 31 August. Exceptions to this rule are children aged under 12, and people who have a disability or mental/physical health condition that prevents them from complying. Please remember to also observe two-metre social distancing practices at bus stops.
