

Let's Go for BikeReady programme!

Almost 7000 Whanganui students have benefited from a cycling education package delivered by Mā Ake Let's Go, part of Whanganui District Council's active transport programme.

Mā Ake Let's Go is in its fifth year of delivering the BikeReady programme to all Whanganui schools. The national cycling education programme is funded by Waka Kotahi NZ Transport Agency.

Let's Go active transport facilitator, Norman Gruebsch, says 31 Whanganui schools have participated, involving 6814 students. Of those, 1454 students have gone on to complete grade two, using quiet streets and shared pathways to get around town.

Norman Gruebsch says one of the highlights has been the organisation's input into moving students from basic skills in grade one, to gaining confidence and knowledge at grade two, to regularly use cycling as a transport option.

Grade two learning has involved group rides along Te Tuaiwi shared pathway, with students demonstrating good cycling etiquette, becoming familiar with the shared pathway and learning how to cross safely at intersections.

Let's Go coach Greg Fromont says watching the students' skillsets and road abilities grow has been rewarding. "The bonus is watching their confidence and self-esteem grow with it."



Whanganui Intermediate School principal Katherine Ellery says the programme's focus on using shared pathways has led to more students cycling to and from the intermediate school. "We regularly have over 100 bikes and almost as many scooters at the school."

The council has received funding approval from Waka Kotahi for the next three-year block – from 2021/22 to 2023/24. The Mā Ake Let's Go programme contract will go out for tender soon with interested organisations encouraged to submit.

Upcoming Raupo St road closure is for service upgrades

Raupo Street from Heads Road to Hinau Street will be closed to all traffic from Monday, 1 November 2021 for Whanganui District Council contractors to undertake stormwater and wastewater upgrades. This work is scheduled to be completed in approximately six months.

During the upgrade all traffic in this part of Raupo Street will be diverted into Hinau Street so that vehicle users can access Rogers Street or Mosston Road as alternate routes to avoid the work area. Traffic in Heads Road will be reduced to one lane with traffic light controls while work takes place at the intersection of Heads Road and Raupo Street. Please note that affected Raupo Street residents will have access to their properties at all times during this work.

The installation of stormwater and wastewater pipes in this area will allow for the separation of these flows, and significantly improve stormwater and wastewater levels of service the council provides to the community. This work will also reduce wet weather flows in the city's wastewater system, reducing the risk of flooding that is key to meeting environmental objectives. The upgrade will also accommodate current and anticipated growth in Whanganui's urban area.

The course aims to build the confidence of older drivers and update their knowledge of how ageing affects driving, road code changes, licence renewal for 75+ and safe driving practices. A booklet and luncheon will be provided. **CarFit** is a 20-minute free check that helps older drivers maximise safety and comfort in their vehicles.
