After missing 2021, Santa Claus has confirmed he'll be making the journey from the North Pole to Whanganui this year to attend the much-loved Mainstreet Christmas Parade from 2.00pm on Saturday, 10 December 2022.



Speaking from his top-secret toy production facility in the Arctic, Mr Claus said he was excited at the prospect of returning to the awa city to join revellers at Whanganui's biggest community celebration. "Ho, ho, ho – few places embrace the yuletide spirit like Whanganui, so I'm very much looking forward to seeing all the wonderful floats make their way down Victoria Avenue!"

Mainstreet Whanganui's Santa Relations Advisor, Geoff Follett, says, "We've already locked in perennial Christmas float favourites like the tram, buzzy bee, Thomas the Tank Engine and, of course, the jolly red man himself in his Santa sleigh. Hyltons Pit pest control

Overnight operation for two weeks

Whanganui District Council contractors began a pest control night operation at Hyltons Pit on Monday, 21 November. The rabbit and possum control work will take place over a two-week period and is needed to prevent ongoing damage to recent community plantings in this area.

The fortnight-long operation is weather dependent and scheduled to take place overnight until Saturday morning, 3 December 2022 inclusive from 10.00pm until 6.00am. The reserve will reopen to the public during the day throughout the work.

Shared pathway work

Upgrade to Whanganui East section

Maintenance to a section of shared pathway in Whanganui East between the Whanganui Multisport Club and Dublin Street Bridge started on Monday, 21 November and will continue until Thursday, 22 December 2022.

The existing asphalt is being replaced with concrete as an upgrade to this part of the shared pathway. Pedestrians and cyclists will be able to follow a detour around the construction area.

Lake Wiritoa spraying

Hornwort management next week

As part of managing the invasive water weed hornwort (Ceratophyllum demersum) in Lake Wiritoa, Whanganui District Council contractors will spray Reglone herbicide in the designated public swimming and water skiing areas on Monday, 28 November 2022.
