New angle on safety for city cyclists

A type of road marking new to Whanganui has recently been introduced to a city-centre intersection.

Whanganui District Council's Active Transport Facilitator, Norman Gruebsch, says a hook turn box (shown far right) has been painted on the road at the intersection of Victoria Avenue and Glasgow Street, and another will soon be added to the intersection of Victoria Avenue and Dublin Street.

"With its network of shared pathways, Whanganui is a very appealing city for people who want to get around town by bike," Mr Gruebsch says.

"Adding hook turn boxes makes Whanganui even better for cyclists because it gives them a safer way to turn right at busy intersections."

By doing a hook turn, cyclists avoid having to cross in front of traffic travelling in the opposite direction. Instead, they can stay on the left side of the road at all times.

Mr Gruebsch says he wants to get the message out to all road users so drivers understand cyclists' behaviour at these intersections.



A hook turn is a right turn you complete in two steps:

- Keeping left, ride straight across the intersection to the hook turn box, turn your bike and wait in the box.
- Next, when the traffic lights change ride across the intersection with the traffic.

Cyclists can complete a hook turn at most intersections, even if there is no hook turn box marking.

Water will be shut-off to properties in the Somme Parade/Aramoho area between **10.00pm and 12 midnight tonight, Wednesday, 23 September 2020** for the repair of a fire hydrant.

The affected area includes Somme Parade (from Cedar Drive to Flemington Road) and Delhi Avenue, Lucknow Street, Burmah Street, Bombay Street and Madras Street.

• Review of Street Infrastructure Bylaw

Whanganui District Council has confirmed its Street Infrastructure Bylaw 2015 with amendments after undertaking a review pursuant to section 160 of the Local Government Act 2002. The amendments come into effect on **Monday, 5 October 2020**. A copy of the bylaw is available online at: www.whanganui.govt.nz or from Council Customer Services at 101 Guyton Street.

• Temporary sign applications now online

Whanganui District Council now has an online form available to apply for a temporary sign on designated council reserve land. This is applicable for community/event signage on the display structures located at Dublin Street, Carlton Avenue and Hakeke Street. To access this form, visit: www.whanganui.govt.nz/temporary-sign

• Tankered waste disposal charges to apply

From **Monday, 28 September 2020** waste disposal companies will be charged for tankered waste that is discharged into Whanganui's wastewater treatment system. Tankered waste, which includes domestic septic tank waste, will be disposed of at the approved collection facility at Beach Road. The charge per cubic metre will cover treatment and disposal costs.

ShakeOut is New Zealand's annual nationwide earthquake drill and tsunami hikoi (evacuation) and this year's official event takes place on **Thursday, 15 October 2020 at 9.30am**. The event is intended to remind and educate people about the right action to take - "Drop, Cover and Hold" and "Long or Strong, Get Gone" - in the event of an earthquake and/or tsunami. (Not all people may be able to easily drop - the best action to take in this case is to stop moving and brace yourself against a wall or furniture.)
