## Wakefield St Bridge funding approval

Whanganui District Council can now move forward with a group of significant infrastructure projects after Waka Kotahi NZ Transport Agency approved all safety projects in the council's roading programme for 2021-24.

The projects are part of a package of almost \$10 million for the council's low-cost, low-risk safety programme announced as part of Waka Kotahi funding for the next three years.

The council's senior roading engineer, Brent Holmes, says Waka Kotahi's acceptance of all council bids for safety improvements is great news for Whanganui.

The projects approved for subsidised funding include the replacement of the Wakefield Street Bridge in Whanganui East, the Aramoho Rail Bridge pedestrian walkway clip-on and Erni's Bridge at Kaurapaoa.

"It's fantastic that all our projects were accepted – they are not easy projects. For instance, Wakefield Street Bridge on No 3 Line crosses over an operational railway yard."

The council has been seeking Waka Kotahi approval to replace the Wakefield Bridge since 2014. Mayor Hamish McDouall says the council's infrastructure team had provided compelling business cases to Waka Kotahi for the funding and it was pleasing to see all projects accepted.

Demolition of the Victory Shed is underway at the Whanganui wharves as part of the revitalisation of Whanganui's port.

This work will be carried out from Monday to Saturday over a five-week period (until mid-December 2021). We expect there will be additional heavy truck movements during this time in both Tod Street and Wharf Street, Castlecliff.

We ask members of the public to avoid using Tod Street during this time. Extreme caution should be taken when accessing Wharf Street.

If you need a Land Information Memorandum (LIM) report before the 2021-22 Christmas / New Year holiday period, your completed application form and payment must reach Whanganui District Council no later than **5.00pm on Friday, 10 December 2021**.

Applications made after Friday, 10 December 2021 may not be processed before the council closes for the holiday period at 12 noon on Friday, 24 December 2021.

The statutory 10-working day processing timeframe for LIM applications will be suspended from 12 noon on Friday, 24 December 2021 until Thursday, 13 January 2022 inclusive.

The council reopens for the new year at 8.30am on Wednesday, 5 January 2022.
