Do you have any unwanted chemicals like insecticides, batteries and solvents at home? Whanganui District Council is once again running a hazardous waste drop-off service for



households only on **Saturday**, **28 March 2020**. Your hazardous waste must be registered and approved by the Council before this date to be accepted.

Once registered, you'll be contacted with a drop-off location and time between **9.00am and 1.00pm on Saturday, 28**March. Spaces are limited to a "first in, first served" basis and only registered and approved hazardous waste will be accepted. Stormwater main renewal

Whanganui District Council advises that a section of Somme Parade between Halswell and Glasgow streets will be closed for two weeks from **Monday**, **2 March 2020** for renewal of a stormwater main in nearby Gloucester Street.

The stormwater main is being renewed to reduce flooding risk to properties in low-lying areas of the catchment north of London and Halswell streets. The project is expected to be completed by mid-September 2020.

The two-week Somme Parade closure, from 7.00am on Monday, 2 March to 6.00pm on Monday, 16 March 2020, will allow contractors to work safely and provide access for heavy machinery. During the closure the following access provisions will be in place:

- Access for residents and emergency services only will be provided at all times to properties on Somme Parade and Gloucester Street.
- All trucks and buses must use Pitt and Glasgow streets at all times during the closure because of low trees and the roundabout in Halswell Street.
- Light vehicles are to use Halswell Street only.
- Gloucester Street from Glasgow Street to Somme Parade will also be closed.
