

# New animal pound is taking shape

Construction of Whanganui District Council's new animal pound on Airport Road is well under way and running to schedule. Work began after the move to COVID-19 Alert Level 3 in mid-June.

Council Project Manager, Caleb McGrail, says, "All concrete foundations for the new facility have been poured and structural framing is now in place.

"The main office building has also been wrapped and roofed in preparation for the installation of exterior windows and cladding."

Blockwork for the 47 individual kennel spaces, including a whelping kennel, has also started. The kennels will each have auto-fed water stations and raised fold-out beds. A UV-resistant roof with acoustic properties, along with an outdoor canopy, will shelter the animals.

Caleb McGrail says, "The Council's Animal Management Officers have also been involved in the finishing touches for the new dog kennels to ensure maximum practical use under new legislative compliance requirements.

"Ongoing fortnightly site visits are planned to let staff view progress as we move forward."

Work on the Council's new animal pound is scheduled to be completed by November 2020.

## Single-use plastic 'swaps'

Whanganui District Council and Plastic Free Whanganui combined efforts again this year for Plastic Free July, the global movement aimed at reducing plastic pollution. The theme for 2020 focuses on simple "swaps" for single-use plastic items.

The Council's Waste Advisor, Stuart Hylton, says, "Plastic Free July is a great initiative because it reminds people to take the time to audit their use of plastic and find alternatives."

### Rural scenes at the Sarjeant

### **Rates postponements**

Whanganui District Council has adopted a Rates Postponement Policy that allows individuals and businesses who are facing financial hardship as a result of COVID-19 some additional flexibility to make payments over a longer period as recovery allows cashflows to improve. Those who meet the policy's criteria will be able to postpone the **2019/20 fourth-quarter rates** due on 27 May 2020 to **25 November 2020** (ie: postponed for up to six months).

All **2020/21 rates** will also be able to be postponed to **30 June 2021**, allowing ratepayers the full year to pay their 2020/21 rates. Any amount up to the total value of rates payable can be postponed as long as an agreed direct debit is place to ensure that the rates are fully paid by the date they have been postponed to.

There is no charge for postponing 2019/20 fourth-quarter rates. A postponement fee will apply to 2020/21 rates based on the amount being postponed. To apply, you must be the ratepayer of the property as per the Rating Information Database (RID) or their authorised agent.
