

New signs for Pākaraka this summer

Mai i Ngāti Maika, Manutohikura ee, Pūorotia te reo maimaia a te tōpuni rākau Karaka o te wao o Ngāti Maika te pae o Rauru kiitahi. Numi aronui mai e ngā manu o te uta o te tai. Hei whakamauri ake i te rangi e tohia ai te ingoa o Pākaraka. Te Kawa ora ee.

Ngāti Maika, hapū of Ngā Rauru Kītahi, has advised that signs naming the locality of Pākaraka will be installed at each end of the township in January 2023.

Ngāti Maika spokesperson, Derek Carroll, says the hapū is looking forward to an inclusive occasion to mark the event. "Details have yet to be finalised, but this will be open to all members of the community. Ngāti Maika is currently liaising with Whanganui District Council and Waka Kotahi NZ Transport Agency with regards to traffic management to ensure the signs can be blessed and installed safely."

Ngāti Maika applied to the New Zealand Geographic Board in 2021 to change the name of the locality of Maxwell to Pākaraka, a name that means a settlement surrounded by an abundance of karaka trees, and the application was upheld in February 2022.

Whanganui District Council supported the application and assisted with community consultation, which was required as part of the renaming process. Two hundred and fiftyfive submissions were received with 189 supporting the renaming of Maxwell to the proposed name of Pākaraka.

UPCOMING ROAD WORKS

- Smithfield Road from Carlton Avenue to Moore Avenue will be closed to all through traffic for infrastructure scoping work from 7.00am to 5.00pm on Monday, 5 December until Wednesday, 7 December 2022 inclusive. New underground pipelines are scheduled to be installed in this area early next year. Residents and emergency vehicles will have access to properties at all times during the work, and detour signs will be displayed.
- Brunswick Road from Weka Street to the intersection of Blueskin and Brunswick roads will be closed to all through traffic for culvert and road repairs from **9.00am to 5.00pm** from Monday, 5 December until Wednesday, 7 December 2022 inclusive. Access for residents and emergency services will be available at all times, and this part of Brunswick Road will reopen overnight with speed restrictions.

Associations with the name Maxwell have been a grievance carried for generations and are a reminder of historical pain, in particular the attack on Māori children in 1868 in what is known as the Handley Woolshed incident.

The Ngā Rauru Deed of Settlement recognised the Handley Woolshed incident and encouraged discussions between Whanganui District Council and the Ngā Rauru Iwi Authority or the Governance Entity in relation to the name of the town of Maxwell.

Whanganui District Council's chief executive, David Langford, says, "The council has provided the signs for Pākaraka and we will assist with the installation in January. This will be a moving and historic occasion and we are pleased to be able to continue our support in this way."

Applications made after Friday, 9 December may not be processed before the council closes for the holiday period at 12 noon on Friday, 23 December 2022.

Council housing policy

Updated policy effective 1 December

Whanganui District Council has updated its Older Persons' Council Housing Policy to now include the keeping of pets at council-owned housing complexes. Following a successful pet trial at several complexes in mid-2021, residents at all council housing complexes are now able to keep fish and birds. Residents at most complexes can now also keep a cat, with these exceptions:

- Ladysmith complex 6 Kawakawa Street
- Walter Nash complex Walter Nash Place
- Konini / Parsons complex 189 Parsons Street
- Kawakawa / Nixon complex 1 Kawakawa / 66 Nixon streets.
