

New Sarjeant wing to shimmer light

Whanganui district councillors have endorsed a change of design and material for the façade of the Sarjeant Gallery's new extension wing, Te Pātaka o Sir Te Atawhai Archie John Taiaroa, and given the green light for new materials to be ordered.

Project director, Gaye Batty, says
Oamaru stone was originally specified
for the façade of the building.
"However, when the current supply of
stone was tested, it did not meet the
required specification for the building.
The project team was then charged
with finding an acceptable alternative
for the façade.

"The result is an inspirational new concept for the façade which will be constructed from dark stone panels, highlighted by splashes of shiny steel Tioata inserts to create the effect of light shimmering on the water.

"This light effect that can be seen under certain conditions on the Whanganui River is referred to as Kānapanapa and it is the key design narrative for the building chosen through a series of workshops with the architect Warren and Mahoney and Te Kāhui Toi, the artist group appointed by Te Rūnanga o Tūpoho."
