London Street works

Retaining wall work starts on Monday

Construction of a 100 metre-long concrete and steel retaining wall on London Street - opposite the Z Energy service station and between Fergusson Street and the Whanganui SPCA Centre - will begin on Monday, 9 November 2020. This work is scheduled to finish in late February 2021 and will complete the London Street shared

Traffic management will be in place along this part of London Street (also State Highway 3) during the work. On-street parking in this area will be restricted, lane widths reduced and a 30km/h temporary speed restriction imposed. Access to private and commercial properties will remain. Please note SH3 lane closures with associated detours may be required during the works.
