

Heritage Month takes centre stage

Sarjeant Gallery Te Whare o Rehua Whanganui will celebrate Whanganui Heritage Month with a series of events during October at Sarjeant on the Quay and the Davis Lecture Theatre.

Richard Taylor Revealed will be a discussion between historian Huia Kirk and the Sarjeant's Relationships Officer, Jaki Arthur, about the life of 19th century missionary Reverend Richard Taylor and his place in Whanganui history. This free event will take place at Sarjeant on the Quay, 38 Taupo Quay, on **Sunday, 18 October from 4.30pm**.

"The Whanganui Incident" – the shooting incident involving Mayor Charles Mackay (pictured) that occurred 100 years ago – is featured the following weekend. Whanganui Mayor Hamish McDouall will lead a lively discussion with historian Paul Diamond, and playwright and actor David Charteris about this "notorious" episode at the Davis Lecture Theatre, Drews Avenue, on **Friday**, **23 October from 7.30pm**. Tickets cost \$15.00 – Gallery Friends and Stars, \$10.00.

And on **Saturday**, 24 October at 7.30pm and **Sunday**, 25 October at 4.30pm, playwright and actor David Charteris will perform his solo show, *One of Those: The Story of Mayor Charles Mackay*, at Sarjeant on the Quay, 38 Taupo Quay. Tickets cost \$25.00 – Gallery Friends and Stars, \$20.00.
