

Have your say on climate change

Late last year Whanganui District Council initiated a discussion with the community on addressing climate change in the district.

Since then, the council has taken the community's ideas into account and worked with local iwi and key stakeholders to produce a comprehensive draft climate change strategy that recognises both Māori and New Zealand European worldviews. It is now inviting the community to share their thoughts on the draft strategy.

The four focus areas the draft strategy covers are:

- Transport
- Building energy and urban form
- Agriculture
- Leadership and collaboration.

Dog Control Policy and Bylaw review input sought

Whanganui District Council is seeking community feedback on the review of its Dog Control Policy and Bylaw. The proposed changes include:

- Requiring dog owners to pass a written test of dog ownership knowledge in order to qualify as a responsible dog owner for the first time
- Increased dog access on Castlecliff Beach
- Requiring dogs to be under control on a leash on all walkways, cycleways and shared paths (excluding places dogs are prohibited such as premier parks and lakes)
- Formalising the council's existing policy on the rehoming of dogs.

Illegal dumping campaign

Councillor Rob Vinsen, head of Whanganui District Council's Waste Minimisation Advisory Group, is leading a campaign to crack down on illegal rubbish dumping in the Whanganui District.



Cr Vinsen says one important aspect of the campaign is getting the message out that there are now significantly harsher penalties for people who are caught dumping rubbish illegally. He says in the past six months five people have received infringement notices and been fined \$400.00.

Technology is making it harder for people to get away with illegal dumping, Cr Vinsen says. "Everyone has a camera on their phone so as a community we can rally around and work together to target this selfish behaviour.

"There's a fantastic app we're encouraging people to download called Snap Send Solve. It lets you take a photo of the rubbish and email it to the council, using your phone's GPS to show exactly where the rubbish is located. The emailed message goes straight to the Customer Services team who log it and refer it on to the relevant council team."

Some plumbing fittings have the potential to allow minute traces of metals to accumulate in water standing in the fittings for several hours. Although the health risk is small, the Ministry of Health recommends that you flush a mugful of water from your drinking-water tap each morning before use to remove any metals that may have dissolved from the plumbing fittings. The Ministry of Health recommends this simple precaution for all households, including those on public and private water supplies.
