- (e) whether (in its opinion) the amenity and good order of the locality would be likely to be reduced, by more than a minor extent, by the effects of the issue of the licence:
- (f) the days on which and the hours during which the applicant proposes to sell alcohol:
- (g) the design and layout of the premises concerned:
- (h) whether the applicant has appropriate systems, staff and training to comply with the law:
- (i) any areas of the premises that the applicant proposes should be designated as restricted areas or supervised areas:

- (j) any steps the applicant proposes to take to ensure that the requirements of this Act in relation to the sale and supply of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed:

### 3. Reporting Agencies

The following reports were received under section 141 of the Act.

**Medical Officer of Health** – No objection within report received on 8<sup>th</sup> November 2016.

**Licensing Inspector Report** – Full report provided by the inspector including assessment of application against section 142 criteria. The Inspector concludes that the application is complete and will likely meet the criteria of the Act. Draft conditions are also offered by the inspector.

The inspector noted the following pertinent points in her report –

- The applicant is Wanganui North Rotary.
- The school has been a venue for other special licences before with no known non-compliance issues.
- · Suitability is not challenged.
- The hall is part of a large school complex with alcohol not playing a large part of the event. Issuing a special licence should not reduce amenity and good order of the locality.
- The hall is suitable for the type of event and layout has been suitable in the past.
- The hours appear reasonable for the event being undertaken.
- A non-certified manager (Shaun Hogan) is nominated for the event and accordingly a s. 213(2) waiver is sought.
- No designation for the event has been requested and this is supported.
- Both the Police and MOH have no objections to the application.

#### 4. Decision

The application for Special Licence is **Approved** for issue subject to the conditions outlined in the inspectors report and a s. 213 waiver.

### REPORT OF THE LICENSING INSPECTOR

This report is made in accordance with section 141(2) of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012.

### (a) Does this application meet the Object of the Act?

- (1) The object of this Act is that—
  - (a) the sale, supply, and consumption of alcohol should be undertaken safely and responsibly; and
  - (b) the harm caused by the excessive or inappropriate consumption of alcohol should be minimised.
- (2) For the purposes of subsection (1), the harm caused by the excessive or inappropriate consumption of alcohol includes—
  - (a) any crime, damage, death, disease, disorderly behaviour, illness, or injury, directly or indirectly caused, or directly or indirectly contributed to, by the excessive or inappropriate consumption of alcohol; and
  - (b) any harm to society generally or the community, directly or indirectly caused, or directly or indirectly contributed to, by any crime, damage, death, disease, disorderly behaviour, illness, or injury of a kind described in paragraph (a).

For the reasons following, I believe this application will meet the Object of the Act.

### (b) <u>Description of Special Occasion:</u>

The nature of the particular event for which the licence is sought is a Wanganui Rotary North Fundraising Event. The event will be held in the Wanganui Collegiate 'Big School' building.

### (c) Suitability of Applicant:

The applicant is the Wanganui North Rotary who wish to raise funds for the purpose of funding a Surgical Toolkit for Samoa. The School has an international reputation and therefore the applicant will not put that name at risk by any noncompliant activities. The School has hosted special licences previously and as far as I am aware they have always been well run and compliant.

### (d) Any relevant Local Alcohol Policy:

There is no local alcohol policy in force at this time.

# (e) <u>Is the amenity and good order of the locality likely to be reduced, by more</u> than a minor extent, by the effects of the issue of this licence:

Alcohol consumption will not play a big part in the event proposed and therefore I do not believe that the amenity and good order of the locality will be reduced in anyway.

## (f) <u>Days, Dates and Hours which the applicant proposes to sell alcohol, are as</u> follows:

25 November 2016, between 6.00pm and 10.30pm has been requested. These hours are reasonable.

### (g) Design and layout of the premises:

I do not see any issues with the proposed layout and use of the premises. It has worked satisfactorily for a number of previous similar events.

## (h) Does the applicant have the appropriate systems, staff and training to comply with the law?

Shaun Hogan has been nominated to ensure compliance with the conditions of the licence.

It is recommended that the requirements for a manager be waived in terms of section 213(2) of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012.

# (i) Does the applicant propose that any part of the premises be designated as supervised or restricted - and if so, which parts?

No request was made for any area to be designated. I do not see any need for one either.

# (j) What steps does the applicant take to ensure that the requirements of this Act in relation to the sale and supply of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed?

The applicant states that they have experience Rotary Club Members to control the event. All staff will be briefed on the requirements that need to be met, such as no sale or supply to minors or intoxicated persons.

### (k) What is the applicant's proposals relating to host responsibility practices?

In addition to providing a range of non-alcoholic beverages and water, a range of food will also be provided.

### (l)(1) Police Report:

The Police have enquired into the application, and in a report dated 8<sup>th</sup> November 2016 advised that they do not oppose the granting of this application.

### (l)(2) Medical Officer of Health Report:

The Medical Officer of Health has also enquired into the application, and in the report dated 8<sup>th</sup> November 2016 advised that there is no opposition to the issuing of the licence.




