DECISION

1. Introduction

This is an application by **Jack Thomas Bullock** for Temporary Authority (first) in respect of the premises situated at 85 Glasgow Street, Whanganui and known as 'Reset Cafe'.

The application comes about from a change of ownership and is required to allow the applicant to continue trading while the application for a new licence is processed by the Licensing Committee. This is the first Temporary Authority made by the applicant against the licence. The applicant has a substantive On-licence applied for that will take time to be processed and determined.

2. Application

The application is made against On-licence **036/ON/005/2022** which has an expiry date of 27 November 2023.

The application was not advertised and no objection or notice of desire to be heard has been received under section 103 of the Act. Accordingly we deal with the matter on the papers in accordance with sections 136 and 202(1) of the Act.

In considering the application for temporary authority the committee had regard to the object of the Act and reports furnished by Police and Inspector.

3. Reporting Agencies

The following reports were received under the Act.

Police Report – No opposition from Police.

Licensing Inspector Report – The inspector notes that the applicant is an individual of good standing in the community as well as experience in the industry locally. He is supported by his wife who will be the certified manager for the start up period. The applicant takes possession on the 1 June 2023 and has supplied relevant documents with the application.

The inspector concludes that the application is complete and meets the criteria of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012. The inspector recommends that the licence be issued subject to conditions.

I concur with the inspector's assessment and conditions.

4. Decision

Accordingly the application for Temporary Licence is **Approved**, valid for 3 months from the date it takes effect from or when the Substantive Licence Application lodged by the applicant is determined, whichever is the sooner.

The Temporary Authority can be issued immediately with the conditions recommended in the inspectors report.
