

Awards to shine light on Whanganui

Whanganui is entering the national Keep New Zealand Beautiful Awards that celebrate towns, cities and local heroes who lead the way with outstanding environmental and beautification

Information about Whanganui District Council and community beautification and environmental initiatives is currently being gathered to form a comprehensive entry, which must be submitted by Wednesday, 31 July 2019. Individuals, schools and groups can also submit their own entries.

Local initiatives identified include the Whanganui Walls street art festival (pictured), Coastcare activities, the Urban Shared Pathways initiative, Whanganui's Town Regeneration Project, Bushy Park activity, litter and anti-dumping initiatives, the Heritage Grant Scheme and many more.

Councillors Helen Craig and Rob Vinsen were keen for the Council to submit an entry for the first time this year. "Whanganui has outstanding natural and built features that we should celebrate and put on a national stage," Cr Craig



"We also strive to enhance our environment with beautification and clean-up projects," Cr Vinsen says, "and entering these awards will help raise the importance of these initiatives in our community and hopefully accelerate projects to keep Whanganui beautiful."

Make sure you're enrolled

With local elections coming up in October this year, are you sure that you're enrolled to vote?

From Wednesday, 29 June, everyone currently enrolled should have received an enrolment update pack in the **LOCAL ELECTIONS**

mail. All you need to do is check that your details are right. If they're correct, you don't need to do anything more. If your details do need updating, make the changes and send them back to the Electoral Commission immediately.

You need to enrol before you can vote. If your pack hasn't arrived, it means you're not enrolled to vote or your details are not up to date. To enrol or update your details, you'll need to fill in a new enrolment form.

To enrol, check, or update your details online, please visit: www.vote.nz/enrol-to-vote/enrol-check-or-update You can also call the Electoral Commission on 0800 36 76 56 to request an enrolment form.

You can enrol if you're 18 or older, a New Zealand citizen or permanent resident, and have lived in New Zealand for more than one year continuously at some time in your life.

Site preparation includes tree removal

Whanganui District Council has started work on a new box-culvert over the Awarua Stream on Wikitoria Road in Putiki. Site work on the culvert began late last week and will be completed by Friday, 13 September 2019.

Some large willow trees next to the road will be felled in preparation for the culvert's construction. Traffic management will be in place during construction.

Waste Minimisation Fund support
