

Guyton Street revamp in the works!

Central Guyton Street – between St Hill and Wicksteed streets (pictured) – is set to be revitalised under the Streets for People programme. By February 2024, the area will have new seating, greenery, lighting and street art that reflects Whanganui's unique history and culture.

Project lead Diana Veitch says the vision is to create a more inviting and accessible space for our community and visitors to Whanganui to enjoy. Infrastructure changes will happen first from mid-November, and the street art and greenery will be added later. The infrastructure changes will include:

- a roundabout at the intersection of Wicksteed and Guyton streets
- new raised pedestrian platforms
- extensions to existing kerb build-outs (removes a total of four car parks)
- at least two new mobility car parks.



The overall redesign will slow traffic moving through the area to a speed that's safer for pedestrians and cyclists.

To minimise any disruption, the work will be carried out overnight, and has been planned for mid-November to coincide with road resurfacing work already scheduled. This project is 90 percent funded by Waka Kotahi NZ Transport Agency's Streets for People fund.

The assessment process involved measuring, checking safety aspects in relation to regulations, and test rides from nominated cyclists.
