Rotokawau Virginia Lake fountain seen in new light

The Higginbottom Fountain at Rotokawau Virginia Lake now has a new lease on life after comprehensive upgrades were completed late last year.

Whanganui District Council Parks Team Leader, Wendy Bainbridge, says the lights on the fountain "were continually failing and had become uneconomic to repair".

The upgrade was a complex procedure that involved installing new LED lights and drilling under the lake to replace ducting and cabling.

Powerco donated \$10,000 towards the upgrade, and funds were also provided by the Eleanor Burgess Trust with the Council contributing to installation costs.

If you haven't already, get up to the lake to see the new swan mural on the fountain box by local artist Amla Meijer – the fountain also has a free 40-minute lighting display every evening that coincides with the switching on of streetlights.

The light display can be activated at any other time by putting a gold coin into the fountain box's slot mechanism.

Consultation on speed limit bylaw review

Submissions close 8 February 2019

Public consultation on changes to speed limits on Castlecliff Beach, and Rapanui and Francis roads closes at 4.00pm on Friday, 8 February 2019.

Whanganui District Council is reviewing the speed limits on Castlecliff Beach and is proposing to reduce the speed limit from 100km/h to 30km/h.

Also included in the proposed amendment is a reduction in the speed limit around Westmere School and on Rapanui Road, from Westmere School to State Highway 3, from 100km/h to 80km/h.
