

Free Tide rides for Vintage Weekend!

Getting to Whanganui Vintage Weekend will be easy for everyone, with Connect - Horizons Regional Transport and Whanganui District Council putting on increased and free public transport services.

Horizons' manager transport services, Mark Read, says Te Ngaru The Tide will be running an extended timetable, while all urban bus services in Whanganui will also be free from this Saturday, 20 January until and including Monday, 22 January (which is the Wellington Anniversary public holiday).

"We know Whanganui Vintage Weekend is massive for the city, with people traveling from near and far to be part of the party. We're excited to give people free and efficient ways to get across the city over the long weekend.

"The Tide will run on its Friday timetable on Saturday as well – every 20 minutes in both directions from 7.00am until 7.00pm, then hourly until the last service leaving at 11.00pm," Mark Read says. "This means you can get to and from Vintage Weekend events easily no matter what time of day you need to travel."

There will also be some changes to routes due to the Vintage Weekend street pedestrianisations.

Restricted fire season

No open-air fires without a permit

Fire and Emergency New Zealand (FENZ) has moved the Manawatū-Whanganui coastal zone to a **restricted fire**



season until further notice due to warm temperatures, drying winds and low rainfall.

For Whanganui, this means open fires at all local beaches and in the urban area are not allowed without a permit. Check if it's safe to light a fire, and to apply for a FENZ fire permit, by visiting: www.checkitsalright.nz

Regional roadworks

SH4 near the Makatote Viaduct

Allow for extra travelling time if you're heading north on SH4 over the next fortnight due to roadworks near the Makatote Viaduct. Makirikiri Stream Bridge near Turakina

Stop/go traffic management is in place near the Makirikiri Stream Bridge on SH3 south of Turakina from 6.00am-6.00pm weekdays, including some Saturdays, for road maintenance work until the end of January. A 30km/h speed restriction around the worksite also applies during the maintenance period.
