

Be Bright Be Seen during winter!

The Be Bright Be Seen campaign is kicking off for 2023. This winter Whanganui District Council, Green Bikes and Horizons Regional Council are collaborating to bring the Whanganui community safety messages on using cycle ways, shared pathways and roads during the darker months.

Everyone is welcome this Saturday, 20 May 2023, from 9.00am at the Whanganui River Markets on Taupo Quay to join representatives from the council, Horizons, Whanganui Police and Green Bikes, who will be chatting to the community about Be Bright Be Seen.

Free bike lights, backpack covers, reflective vests and other safety swag will be available for people to take away with them, and Green Bikes will be organising a lucky draw to give away a free bike.

Be Bright Be Seen is an annual campaign that educates and encourages people to stay visible when cycling, running and walking at night.
