Signage Policy

We are seeking feedback on the proposed Signage Policy 2018. This policy is a revised version of the existing Signs Bylaw 2015 to

make the signage rules clearer.

The main changes in the policy are:

- that local election signs comply with the same rules as national election signs
- that existing national legislation is utilised to manage the content of signs
- to reduce the maximum height of footpath signs from 1.2 metres to one metre within six metres of an intersection or pedestrian crossing
