

## Interest revving up for parking app

The ParkMate parking app is fast becoming a driving force at Whanganui District Council's pay-and-display car park areas.

Interest in the free app – introduced into Whanganui in early November – is increasing with a steady uptake so far among local residents.

The Council's Compliance Operations Manager, Warrick Zander, said the app was well-recognised throughout New Zealand and it was great that the technology was now available in Whanganui.

"Historically the only payment method in Whanganui has been coins, so it's good to be able to be more customer-friendly and offer an alternative method of payment for parking in our city.

"At the same time it's also excellent for people visiting Whanganui who are used to this technology and don't normally carry coins," he said.

Lead Parking Services Officer Sandra Barnes described the ParkMate app as an "easy, stress-free method of parking" and said a lot of regular car parkers had started using the software.

The app is free to download at Google Play or the App Store. Once registered, users can pay for parking with a credit or debit card – a small transaction fee applies.

ParkMate areas include all central city pay-and-display zones. Charges only apply between 8.00am-5.30pm (Monday to Saturday) at the pay-and-display sites.
