The New Zealand International Commercial Pilot Academy (NZICPA) has been awarded a multi-year, multi-million dollar contract to train pilots under a cadet pilot programme for India's most successful airline, IndiGo Airlines. The partnership means that hundreds of IndiGo pilot students will live and train in Whanganui.

NZICPA was established by Whanganui District Holdings Ltd as a regional economic development initiative and operates from a purpose-built professional pilot training complex at Whanganui Airport. The academy currently trains 80 pilots from around the world, contributing \$10M to the economy annually.

NZICPA Board Chair, Matthew Doyle, says he couldn't be ^{(le} more pleased to sign the agreement. "While establishing the NZICPA, we developed a strategy and had planned to be operating cadet pilot training within five years of starting operations from Whanganui – we are therefore well ahead of our programme."

Whanganui Mayor, Hamish McDouall, says he is "extremely excited by this opportunity".

Input wanted on proposed Springvale housing expansion

Whanganui District Council is seeking community feedback on a proposed residential expansion of Springvale. The proposed Springvale Structure Plan was developed to facilitate new housing in the Fitzherbert Avenue, Mosston and Fox Road areas on the western boundary of the city, in response to projected demand for housing land out to 2065.

The plan proposes rezoning properties in the identified area from rural to residential to create a high-quality urban environment, with streets joining onto public spaces and a shared cycleway network linking schools and nearby areas.

Rates rebate reminder

Ratepayers who may qualify for a rates rebate must apply by **Sunday, 30 June 2019 for the 2018/19 rating year** (the rating year runs from 1 July to 30 June).

If your income is low to moderate (maximum \$25,180) you may be eligible for a rates rebate of up to \$630. To determine whether you are eligible, the Council requires your gross income earnings (before tax) for the tax period ending 31 March 2018.

The rates rebate will be calculated on your income earnings and your 2018/19 Whanganui District Council rates and Horizons Regional Council rates. Please contact the Council's rates department on (06) 349 0001 for further information.
