Council Customer Services

Council Customer Services at 101 Guyton Street is open to the public from 8.30am-5.00pm, Monday to Friday.

Upon entry to the building visitors are required to sanitise their hands and provide their contact details to the staff member at the sign-in desk. To maintain social distancing, there is a limit on the number of visitors and it may be necessary to wait before entering the Customer Services area.

Entry is allowed only to those visiting Customer Services for a particular purpose such as paying a bill or for a prearranged meeting with a staff member. General enquiries are being dealt with by the staff member at the sign-in desk. Appointments can be made by calling the Council on (06) 349 0001 or at the sign-in desk.

Instalment 4 rates due next Wednesday, 27 May

A reminder to all ratepayers that the due date for payment of instalment 4 rates is **Wednesday**, 27 **May 2020**.

Rates can be paid online, by direct debit, by internet banking, by credit card and cash/Eftpos. For more information, visit www.whanganui.govt.nz/pay-rates or contact Whanganui District Council's rates department by calling (06) 349 0001. Customer Services is open from 8.30am-5.00pm, Monday to Friday.

Also, ratepayers who may qualify for a rates rebate must apply by Tuesday, 30 June 2020 for the 2019/2020 rating year (the rating year runs from 1 July to 30 June).

If your income is low to moderate (maximum \$25,660) you may be eligible for a rates rebate of up to \$640.00. To determine whether you are eligible, the Council requires your gross income earnings (before tax) for the tax period ending 31 March 2019.

The rates rebate will be calculated on your income earnings and your 2019/2020 Whanganui District Council rates and Horizons Regional Council rates.

Road resurfacing

Carlton Ave-London St roundabout

Waka Kotahi NZ Transport Agency and Higgins have started road resurfacing work at the Carlton Avenue-London Street roundabout. The overnight work began at 6.00pm on Tuesday, 19 May 2020 and is scheduled to be completed by 5.00am this Saturday, 23 May 2020. London Street, Carlton Avenue and Fitzherbert Avenue will remain open during the work with controlled access. (In the event of wet weather, the resurfacing will be postponed to the next fine day.) Entering the roundabout will only be possible from London Street or Fitzherbert Avenue. Please follow the detour signs and expect minor delays. The following roads will be closed each night from 6.00pm to

- Carlton Avenue extension between Parsons Street and Fitzherbert Avenue
- Carlton Avenue into Churchill Crescent
- London Street from Konini Street to the roundabout
- Purnell Street from Selwyn Crescent to London Street.

Residents and emergency services will have access to affected properties at all times during the work.

Rating database

Whanganui District Council's Rating Information Database (RID) is available for public inspection under section 28 of the Local Government (Rating) Act 2002. The RID contains a record of all information required for setting and assessing rates and allows for the calculation of rates liability for each rating unit. The database is available for viewing between 8:30am and 5:00pm, Monday to Friday, at Council Customer Services, 101 Guyton Street. It is free to inspect the rating information database, but a fee may be charged to supply a copy of particulars from the database.
