

### Public Art Fund opens this Friday!

Calling all artists – Whanganui District Council's Public Art Fund opens for applications this **Friday**, **23 June 2023**! This annual contestable fund seeks to promote the creation and delivery of contemporary and diverse public art that celebrates the distinctive environments, histories and communities of the Whanganui region.

The fund is aimed at established and practising artists who aspire to create artwork in a public space and includes mediums like temporary installations, sculpture, murals, land art, digital art, moving image, and sound or light art. The fund also requires match-funding, which means additional support is a requirement of the fund. This can include in-kind or financial support from external sponsors to assist with material, fabrication or installation costs.

Information sessions are available for those interested in pitching their application idea or asking questions about the process with the council's creative community advisor, Anique Jayasinghe. The 30-minute sessions are available to book between 12.30pm and 2.30pm on Friday, 30 June, or Friday, 7 July. # Flushing of city water mains from today until this Friday



Whanganui's city water mains are receiving a clean out from today, Wednesday 21 June, until and including this Friday, 23 June 2023. Whanganui District Council contractors will complete the daily flushing between 8.00am and 5.00pm over the three days.

Flushing of the water mains throughout Whanganui is used to remove any sediment build-up in pipes as well as ensure that fire hydrants are operating properly. This work involves forcefully releasing water through the pipes, via the hydrants.

If you notice some water discoloration, air in the water, or low water pressure after your street has been flushed we recommend you run your outside taps for 10 to 15 minutes. If the water hasn't cleared after 15 minutes please call the council's infrastructure team on **o6 349 3047** or after-hours on **o6 349 0001**.

### Apply for rebate by Friday, 30 June Ratepayers who may qualify for a rates rebate

Rates rebate reminder

Ratepayers who may qualify for a rates rebate must apply by **Friday, 30 June 2023** for the 2022-23 rating year (the rating year runs from 1 July to 30 June). If your income is low to moderate (maximum \$28,080) you may be eligible for a rates rebate of up to \$700.

To determine whether you are eligible, Whanganui District Council requires your gross income earnings (before tax) for the tax period ending 31 March 2022. The rates rebate will be calculated on your income earnings and your 2022-23 Whanganui District Council rates and Horizons Regional Council rates.
