

## Smithfield Road project progresses

In the past eight weeks about 130 metres of new, bigger stormwater and wastewater pipes have been laid in Smithfield Road by Whanganui District Council contractors. The existing stormwater mains were close to a century old.

Upgrading the wastewater pipes is part of the council's 30-year infrastructure strategy to improve the system. This project will benefit the Smithfield Road, London Street and Konini Street areas by providing a better drainage network to reduce flood risk, help with the projected effects of climate change, and cope with increased demand from new developments. Stage 1 work is expected to be completed at the end of July.

Council contractor ID Loader has completed about 40 percent of stage 1 pipeline work. To keep contractors safe Smithfield Road, from the intersection with Carlton Avenue to the intersection with Moore Avenue, is closed during the construction period with resident-access only. Detours are in place around the worksite.

## Cemeteries and Crematoria Bylaw changes endorsed



Whanganui District Council is looking at its Cemeteries and Crematoria Bylaw, which sets out the way cemeteries and memorials are managed across the district. The following changes were recommended at a meeting of the Strategy and Policy Committee on Tuesday, 16 May 2023, following recent community consultation as part of a bylaw review – changes will be finalised at the next full council meeting:

- Design work approval for a water feature at Aramoho Cemetery, for the purpose of scattering ashes into moving water
- An amendment to the natural burial guidelines
- Grave cleaning to be undertaken by a third-party group only when families cannot be contacted.

The nationwide test of the Emergency Mobile Alert system takes place between 6.00pm and 7.00pm this Sunday, 28 May 2023. An alert will be broadcast to all capable phones. The Emergency Mobile Alert test allows the National Emergency Management Agency to evaluate the system, cell towers, and the ability for mobile phones to receive the alert.
