Karoro Stream enhancement

In collaboration with the Council and the Healthy Streams Whanganui initiative, GasNet will replace its natural gas pipes crossing the Karoro Stream.



The work will be done near the Council's Pumping Station in Karoro Road.

The project involves removing gas pipes that are partly submerged and connecting new sections that were installed under the streambed in 2014. Gas supply to consumers will not be affected.

Once work is complete, the Council will facilitate a community planting project to restore the area.
