

Join in Streets for People workshops

The first community co-design workshops for the lower St Hill Street public transport hub project will take place next week. Everyone is welcome to come along to the conference room at 151 On London Street for the first afternoon workshop from 1.00pm on Thursday, 2 February. An evening workshop will be held on the same day from 5.30pm, and light refreshments will be provided at both.

Workshops are likely to run for two hours. If you'd like to attend either workshop, RSVP by 5.00pm on Tuesday, 31 January to: streetsforpeople@whanganui.govt.nz
The key focus of the workshops will be talking about how a public transport hub next to the Trafalgar Square car park (near the existing bus stops) might look.

The council's general manager community property & places, Sarah O'Hagan, says these workshops are an important part of the public consultation process for this Waka Kotahifunded project. "You'll hear from council staff on parameters and possibilities for the project and have a chance to brainstorm ideas."

The council is inviting stakeholders on St Hill and Guyton streets to take part in the workshops and is keen for members of the wider community to attend. The funding comes from Waka Kotahi's Streets for People fund, which supports councils with projects to make streets more liveable and people-friendly.

ParkMate parking app now on CBD parking meters

The ParkMate smartphone app for parking payments, along with a range of other features such as finding a car park space, is now available at all Whanganui District Council-operated car parks in Whanganui's CBD.

Previously only available in Drew's Avenue / Taupo Quay

Drew's Avenue / Taupo Quay and the council's off-street parking areas, the ParkMate app compliments the ParkEasy payment portal that was introduced when the council upgraded all of Whanganui's parking meters in early 2022.

All CBD parking meters now display a QR code (you can also scan the QR above) and site code for downloading and using the ParkMate app. The ParkMate app can also be downloaded for free from the App Store or Google Play.

- A section of **Heads Road** closed for two nights to all through traffic this week for road repairs concludes at **6.00am this Thursday, 26 January 2023**. Repairs are needed to stabilise this part of Heads Road before a full reseal of the road is completed at a later stage.
- A section of **Tinirau Street between Kepa Street** and **Patapu Street** is closed to all through traffic until **6.00pm this Friday, 27 January 2023** for the installation of a raised roading platform.
- A part of Wicksteed Street near the Wicksteed / Dublin streets intersection is closed for road repairs until 6.00pm this Friday, 27 January 2023. Access to Wicksteed Street will be limited during the work.
- A part of Pukenamu Drive immediately in front of the Sarjeant Gallery Te Whare o Rehua Whanganui will be closed to all through traffic from Drews Avenue to Cameron Terrace for a week from 6.00am this Friday, 27 January until 3.00pm on Friday, 3 February 2023 to allow a crane to work on the redevelopment of the Sarjeant Gallery.
- A section of Fitzherbert Avenue between Burns and London streets will be closed to all through traffic for pre-seal repairs from 6.00am to 6.00pm this Saturday, 28 January and Sunday, 29 January 2023.
- Nixon Street between Anzac Parade and Moana Street is closed to all through traffic for approximately six months until 5.00pm on 30 June 2023 for the installation of new underground infrastructure.
