

Council's LIMs process goes digital

Whanganui District Council will make its Land Information Memorandum (LIM) information available online from Monday, 1 July 2019.

This means people interested in buying a property in the district can access a LIM - which is a summary of the information the Council holds on a property - anywhere, anytime. Once an application is successfully submitted, a LIM is returned digitally within 10 working days.

The Council's LIMs co-ordinator, Nadine McLeay, says people can now also pay by debit or credit card when they make their application.

"Going digital means we are now able to supply the entire property pack, which includes all the plans and consents we have for a property, along with the LIM report. This is really convenient for applicants because they can easily share their digital LIM information with legal advisors and banks, for example."



As set out in the Council's Annual Plan, the fee structure for LIMs has been revised. Residential LIM applications will cost \$250 and commercial LIM applications have been moved to a flat-fee structure of \$275. These fees are payable online at the application stage.



Rates rebate reminder

Ratepayers who may qualify for a rates rebate must apply by Sunday, 30 June 2019 for the 2018/19 rating year (the rating year runs from 1 July to 30 June).

If your income is low to moderate (maximum \$25,180) you may be eligible for a rates rebate of up to \$630. To determine whether you are eligible, the Council requires your gross income earnings (before tax) for the tax period ending 31 March 2018

The rates rebate will be calculated on your income earnings and your 2018/19 Whanganui District Council rates and Horizons Regional Council rates. Please contact the Council's rates department on (06) 349 0001 for further information.

Dog registration fees

Notices sent to dog owners this week

It's time to register your canine friends. Registration notices are being posted this week. If you have not received your notice by Monday, 1 July 2019, please call Whanganui District Council on (06) 349 0001.

Registration fees must be paid in full by Wednesday, 31 July 2019 to receive a prompt payment discount. There are no changes to the fees from 2018/19.

Several payment options are available, including online by credit/debit card (this is the Council's preferred method of payment) - visit: www.whanganui.govt.nz and click on 'Pay It' then 'Pay dog registration'. You will need your 'client number' that can be found at the top of your dog registration notice.

Direct debits can only be made towards future registration periods. Call the Council on (06) 349 0001 to discuss direct debits.

Maria Place access

Building extension for raised platform
