

Industrial zone upgrade underway

Whanganui District Council is strengthening infrastructure in the 120-hectare Mill Road Industrial Zone to build Whanganui's capacity for industrial and manufacturing businesses in this area.

A large stormwater system is being installed under Mill Road. This work will be completed in March 2020. While work is underway speed restrictions and a one-way traffic system controlled by lights are in place.

Stormwater upgrades are also underway in Mosston Road. This is an important part of upgrading the Mill Road Industrial Zone because it builds extra drainage capacity.

Currently 65% complete, the Mosston Road stormwater upgrades are expected to run until October 2019.

The Council's Senior Stormwater Engineer, Kritzo Venter, says, "The Mill Road area has been zoned as industrial for some years, but there has been very little underground to service industrial businesses.

"Recently there has been increased business interest in Whanganui and the Council is responding to this demand by putting the infrastructure in place.

"Council teams have worked together to create a robust plan for the area. Our Planning and Infrastructure teams have worked on this with Whanganui & Partners, who are focused on attracting new businesses to the Mill Road zone.

"Further upgrades to water and wastewater underground infrastructure are also planned in the Mill Road / Mosston Road areas over the next two to three years, which will build further capacity for businesses," Mr Venter says.

Whanganui & Partners' Strategic Lead for Business Development, Rhonda Morris, says, "We're really excited to see the progress made out at Mill Road. We have new businesses interested in the Mill Road area and these upgrades also give existing businesses room to flex."

Once stormwater upgrades are complete Mill Road will be sealed, giving a more direct route to and from Castlecliff.
