

Wakefield St overbridge vehicle limits

Whanganui District Council is reminding heavy vehicle users to avoid using the Wakefield Street overbridge in Whanganui East.

Currently under a maximum weight-limit restriction of 4500kg with a maximum axle loading of 2500kg, the bridge is due to be replaced in the 2024/25 financial year

Signs stating these vehicle restrictions are clearly displayed on either side of the bridge. The bridge also has a speed limit of 30km/h, and a speed hump is in place on the Wakefield Street approach to the bridge.

In the past few months a number of vehicles using the bridge well in excess of the allowable limits have been recorded. Follow-up action has been taken where the company or individual vehicle has been identified.

If your vehicle exceeds either of the weight or axle limits, you must use the alternative route available via Eastown Road. To ensure the bridge can remain open before replacement work begins, it's essential that bridge users follow the heavy vehicle restrictions.



Design work is currently underway for the replacement bridge, which has funding support from NZ Transport Agency Waka Kotahi.

If you're using the Wakefield Street overbridge, please keep to the stated vehicle restrictions and reduced speed limit at all times.

Somme Pde riverbank slip repairs extended into March

The complexity of the work at the Somme Parade drop-out repair site means detours will remain in place until mid-March to keep Whanganui District Council contractors and the community safe.

It was expected the repairs would be completed by the end of January but extra work has been needed, including stabilising the ground underneath the 160-tonne crane as it moved along the site. This involved driving 12-metre-long steel piles under the crane tracks. The drop-out has also continued to slip, with work extending further at both ends of the site
