

Karoro Stream set to be enhanced

Gonville's Karoro Stream will benefit from work to replace natural gas pipes that cross the stream.

In collaboration with Whanganui District Council and the Healthy Streams STREAMS Whanganui initiative, GasNet will soon start replacing the pipes that cross the

stream near the Council's Pumping Station in Karoro Road.

The project involves the removal of three sections of gas pipe that are partly submerged and connecting new sections that were installed under the streambed in 2014.

Removal of the pipes from the stream will enhance the stream's appearance and help with water flow and maintenance works. The work is expected to take up to four weeks to complete.

Once GasNet's work is complete, the Council will begin a community planting project to restore the area with native plantings that would typically have grown in such a coastal

ParkMate roll-out begins 1 November

The Council begins a three-month introduction of the smartphone parking app ParkMate from Thursday, 1 November.

The easy-to-use app is a convenient alternative to carrying cash for parking meters, and also provides a list or map view of available car parks.

The software is free to download for Android devices from the Google Play Store, or the App Store for iPhone owners.

Once registered, users can pay for parking - including a small transaction fee - via a credit or debit card.

Introduction areas include all central city park-and-display zones, along with Whanganui Airport's long-term carpark.
