

Round up of Guyton St improvements

Road safety improvements are on the way for central Guyton Street as part of Whanganui District Council's Waka Kotahi-funded Streets for People project, with new road features expected to be installed this month before urban design work is carried out in early 2024.

The new-look Guyton Street will have seating, greenery, lighting and street art reflecting Whanganui's history and culture.

The council's general manager, community property and places, Sarah O'Hagan, says it's great news that the first physical steps towards implementation of the project will be underway very soon. "In this first phase, the focus is on road layout changes to improve safety and reduce confusion for all road users."

The work is scheduled for 11-12 December (these dates are weather dependent) and will be carried out overnight to minimise any effect on businesses and road users.

The first phase of changes to central Guyton Street will include:

• a new roundabout at the intersection of Wicksteed and Guyton streets to improve safety and reduce vehicle confusion

- raised pedestrian platforms on each of block of central Guyton Street to help reduce vehicle speeds and improve safety and accessibility for pedestrians and wheelchair users
- remarking parking spaces to ensure they are consistent in size (through this, car park loss will be avoided while still adding new streetscape features)
- redesignating the loading zones as mixed-use parking spaces so that they can operate as general parking spaces at certain times of the day.

Wellbeing survey results

More than 660 people responded to a survey about wellbeing and hundreds more shared their ideas with Whanganui District Council at recent engagement events to develop a new wellbeing strategy for Whanganui.

Council project manager, Robyn Vickery, shared a summary of the survey responses with the council's Strategy and Policy Committee on 28 November. She said, "When people were asked what they love and what is unique about Whanganui, the community itself was the standout and many described it as supportive. Te Awa Tupua, the Whanganui River, was central to Whanganui's unique identity. Arts and heritage also featured strongly in these sections with people mentioning Whanganui's wall art, galleries and vibrant music scene.

"In terms of the vision our community has for Whanganui, some key themes emerged from the survey data. These were affordability of housing and the cost of living, the importance of the Whanganui River, availability of housing and service and support for the homeless, cultural and community connection and identity, and maintaining the environment with future generations in mind."

Holiday deadlines for LIM reports / property file requests

LIM report applications

If you need a Land Information Memorandum (LIM) report before the 2023-24 Christmas / New Year holiday period, your completed application form and payment must reach Whanganui District Council no later than 5.00pm this Friday, 8 December 2023. Applications made after Friday, 8 December may not be processed before the council closes for the holiday period at 12 noon on Friday, 22 December 2023.

The statutory 10-working day processing timeframe for LIM applications will be suspended from 12 noon on Friday, 22 December 2023 until Wednesday, 10 January 2024 inclusive.

Property file requests

To obtain a property file before the 2023-24 Christmas / New Year holiday period, Whanganui District Council must receive your request no later than 5.00pm on Monday, 18 December 2023.

This means you will receive the electronic file before the council closes for the holiday period at 12 noon on Friday, 22 December 2023.

Applications received after 5.00pm on Monday, 18 December will be processed when the council reopens at 8.30am on Wednesday, 3 January 2024.

If you're a SuperGold card holder and use a senior parking permit issued by Whanganui District Council, please check the expiry date on your permit to avoid an unwanted infringement notice. If it's out of date, simply bring your old permit into customer services at 101 Guyton St and you'll be issued with a new one - the permits are FREE and last for five years from date of issue. Rotokawau Virginia Lake rat baiting

Whanganui District Council is conducting a summer pest control programme at Rotokawau Virginia Lake **until Wednesday, 20 December 2023**. Rat bait (Pestoff) has been placed in approved bait stations at the Great North Road end of the lake and signs will be on display at nearby lake entrances during the work. Rats are a threat to birdlife at the lake as they prey on eggs and chicks.
