

# Sarjeant redevelopment underway

Whanganui District Council has accepted a tender from Palmerston North construction company, McMillan & Lockwood Ltd, to build the first stage of the Sarjeant Gallery Te Whare o Rehua Whanganui redevelopment project.

The Council voted last Friday, 1 November 2019, to award the \$20 million contract to McMillan & Lockwood to construct the extension wing component of the redevelopment.

This wing – to be named Te Pātaka o Sir Archie John Te Atawhai Taiaroa – will house new galleries, a retail shop, café, education facilities and a state-of-the-art storage space for the gallery's extensive art collection, now and into the future.

Sarjeant Gallery Redevelopment Project Director, Gaye Batty, says, "This contract will be offered on a Fixed Price Lump Sum Basis with a construction contingency.

"As part of contract negotiations, McMillan & Lockwood have been working with the project design team on value-engineering opportunities to reduce procurement costs on the new extension that will ensure the design achieves the Council's budget requirements.

#### New Castlecliff bus shelter

A new bus shelter is scheduled to be installed outside the Rangiora Street Library in Castlecliff. Local glass artist Claire Bell will engrave the glass bus shelter with images of plant and insect life from the Castlecliff sand dunes.

Whanganui District Council's Active Transport Facilitator, Norman Gruebsch, says the support for the shelter and its engraving from the Castlecliff community has been phenomenal. "As well as making bus travel a more comfortable option for our Castlecliff residents, the new bus shelter will also be an attractive feature in the suburb."

Bus shelters are a collaboration between Horizons Regional Council and Whanganui District Council. Horizons advises on location and funds installation, while Whanganui District Council funds ongoing maintenance.



"The second stage of construction – the upgrade of the 100-year-old Sarjeant building, including seismic strengthening – is intended to be awarded at a later date as a variation to this contract," Ms Batty says.

Whanganui Mayor Hamish McDouall says this was an exciting proposal for the new Council to consider. "After the astounding fundraising efforts it will be so rewarding to the community, the donors and all the Sarjeant supporters to see the ongoing build."
