Engraved glass panels set for Taupo Quay bus shelters

Whanganui artist Claire Bell (pictured, with glass panel) has a second public artwork in the pipeline, with engraved glass panels set to be installed in the Intercity bus shelters on Taupo Quay this weekend. Glass panels engraved by the artist were installed in the Rangiora Street bus shelter in Castlecliff last year.

Claire Bell says the idea was "inspired by the race in Aesop's fable – my idea is that there are different kinds of visits to our city, fast and slow, and both kinds are enjoyable".

A blessing for the new bus shelter glass panels will be held at 23 Taupo Quay on **Saturday**, 12 **June at 2.00pm**. The artist will give a short talk about the engraved glass panels at UCOL following the opening.



Drews Ave / Rutland St intersection closure next week

The Drews Avenue / Rutland Street intersection and immediate area will be closed from 7.30am until 7.30pm on Sunday, 13 June and Tuesday, 15 June 2021 respectively for contractors to safely complete roadworks on the Drews Avenue streetscape project. No through access will be available in Drews Avenue between Taupo Quay and Ridgway Street or in Rutland Street on these dates.

The project is part of central government's Innovating Streets funding.

Please note that all businesses in Drews Avenue and Rutland Street will remain open during the work and vehicle access to businesses either side of the site will be available at all times.

A turn-around bay will be in place in Rutland Street to redirect traffic away from the worksite. Alternative routes will be available via Victoria Avenue or Market Place and detour signs will be in place. Dog registration fees

10% discount applies before 31 July

Whanganui District Council is about to issue dog registration notices to all dog owners. Pay your fees on or by **Saturday, 31 July 2021** to qualify for a prompt payment discount of 10 percent.

The council is also introducing new responsible dog owner criteria from 31 July 2021. If you're a current responsible dog owner and pay your dog registration fees by 31 July, your responsible dog owner status will continue and you'll qualify for the annual dog registration discount. Any dog owner without responsible dog owner status after 31 July will need to meet updated guidelines under the council's new Dog Control Policy 2021.
