Over the next 10 years the population of Whanganui is expected to grow, resulting in approximately 1160 additional residential dwellings across the district. This growth will occur within both greenfield development in urban expansion areas and infill development within existing suburbs.

To support this growth, Council needs to provide infrastructure including new pipes, roads and community facilities. Council has three main sources of funding available to provide infrastructure for growth:

- rates
- development contributions
- third-party funding (such as central government funding for roads).

The Development Contributions Policy is a way for Council to collect revenue to pay for growth-related infrastructure in a fair and equitable manner from developers, future residents and those who benefit from growth.

Council is proposing to increase the amount of development contributions collected to pay for growth related infrastructure and offset the burden on rates.
