I would like to submit to the council that it is disappointing that the only submission that can be made on redevelopment of the port area is to who should run the development.

I submit given previous history in the managing of the port that any development should be independently overseen and scrutinised by independent parties. In the case of the Port of Wanganui there should be two fold. The Marine Department for any development and the office of the Auditor General in financial scrutiny.

The council has shown it is inept in regards to the handling of projects and seems to have a history of backing white elephants which has been burdening costs to ratepayers with little accountability.

In the case of Port Endowment land and income, it would appear that the money that should be available for Port Development and has not achieved its desired purpose given the state the Port has been allowed to deteriate to. This by a number of different entities and last but not least the council itself
