road or Mosquito Point. The road is used by boy racers, especially at the weekends and Thursday and Friday night. During the day heavy trucks engine break in to the first and second corners shaking houses on either side of the road. The road is used by a lot of trucks carrying stock, fertiliser, gravel, heavy machinery, logs, milk, fuel and animal feed and the 100k/hr speed limit does more damage to the road and makes the road less safe for users. The road between the cemetery and Mosquito Point is well populated and visibility from some driveways is restricted due to corners and undulations in the road. The propensity for some people to use the stretch of road between the cemetery and the first bend as an opportunity to test drive cars or just race their mates makes walking, bicycling or horse riding along Papaiti Road dangerous. That particular stretch of road can allow a car to reach speeds of over 140k/hr before reaching the first bend and the installation of the barrier has just provided these hoons with a safety barrier that will most likely prevent their death but not that of the people they hit. Although it is a rural road it is a well populated area and there are many tourist vehicles traveling this road to Mosquito Point which is something that is encouraged and promoted. Everyday there are a large number of cyclists, both tourist and training, who use this road. At a speed of 70km/h a trip from Mosquito Point to the cemetery is only two (2) minutes longer and makes the journey safer for everyone. This discussion has been had by many of the residents and now is the time to take action before another person dies or a vehicle vs. horse or cyclist accident happens. If you are not going to reduce the speed limit at least Police it and get some of these hoons off the road.

- 1. We would like to have Kaikokopu Road, Brunswick included in the traffic and bylaw proposal with a reduction from the current 100km/hr to 70 or 80km/hr.
- 2. We would like to have Blueskin Rd between SH3 and Westmere Station Rd, Westmere considered with the speed limit being lowered to 70 or 80km/hr also.

Kaikokopu Road has seen a significant increase in the number of homes and families due to the subdivision of some of the larger farms at the Westmere end of the road. This has led to more children (including ours) walking to the school bus stop at the intersection of Blueskin and Kaikokopu Roads. This intersection is very dangerous to cross with the current speed limits in place and visibility is obscured in 2 of the 3 directions due to the bends and dips in Blueskin Rd.

Many of the cars coming up from Aramoho are travelling at significant speed by the time they get to the flat, straight section of Kaikokopu Road and the width of the road makes it quite dangerous for pedestrians, especially if 2 cars want to pass in opposite directions. I was walking with my kids along the very edge of the road on Tuesday morning and was almost struck by an impatient driver who had to wait for an oncoming car to go before they passed me.

More people are also using bicycles on this road and as there is no pedestrian/bike path, the only option is for them to ride on the road.

We have been told by Whanganui City Council that the overall number of vehicles using Kaikokopu Road vastly exceeds the expected capacity the road was designed for. This alone is a good reason to reconsider the current speed limit. The number of trucks using the road is significantly higher than expected but it is not wide enough for them to pass without one having to pull off the road onto the grass shoulder.

Blueskin Rd is used by a large number of cyclists and the section of road between SH3 and Westmere Station Rd is winding and has dips and crests. This makes it difficult to find places with good visibility to safety pass. This section also often has tractors and farm implements travelling along it causing the same issue. The section between SH3 and Kaikokopu Road also has very little room between the road edges and the fences so there are few options if you are travelling at the designated speed limit and come upon a tractor or bicycle hidden around a bend and oncoming traffic.

Speed limit on Kaikokopu Road and other similar roads

I understand you are reviewing the traffic and speed bylaws. I submit that the speed limit of 100km/h is unsafe on Kaikokopu Road and other similar roads. I suggest that a suitable speed limit would be 70 or 80km/h. The following factors should be considered when setting an appropriate speed limit on any road:

- 1. The road surface is not wide enough for two cars to pass each other in opposite directions at 100km/h
- 2. There is no hard shoulder and on the hill there is no shoulder at all. The roadway falls away into a ditch at the edge of the sealed surface on the hill
- 3. The hill and the lower section has poor visibility for cars approaching each other at 100km/h
- 4. At the top of Kaikokopu Road the density of houses increases the traffic volume. Even though it is a rural zone, the character of Kaikokopu Road is medium density residential. The driveways are close together and some driveways lead to as many as 5 dwellings.
- 5. The bottom of Kaikokopu Road is a gravel road with multiple bends. The surface is unsafe to use at speed.

Please consider this as a specific submission for Kaikokopu Road and also as a general submission for other roads in the district which are too narrow or have poor visibility or poor surface condition making a speed limit of 100km/h unsafe.

This would be part of a complete overhaul of the varying speeds entering the confluence of Mosston, Tayforth, Montgomery and Springvale Roads (and also Caversham Road). Refer now to the following submission.

Yes I agree with this change.

I have been concerned with the danger to west bound Springvale Road traffic waiting to turn into Caversham Road, and traffic leaving the several properties on the south side of Springvale Road when other cars speed up to 70+ KPH and pass on the inside of the waiting car. To change the limit

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to 50 KPH is welcomed but the eastbound traffic should also be reduced.

My suggestion is that the speed limit for all roads entering the "confluence" of Tayforth, Mosston, Montgomery and Springvale roads be limited to 50 KPH. Therefore their exit will be at 50 KPH.

1) Tayforth at present approaches at 100 KPH and is reduced to 70 KPH right at the entrance to the confluence. I suggest that the present 100 KPH would have to be reduced in stages to 50 KPH,

- preferably prior to the bend a few hundred meters before the confluence.
- 2) Mosston reduce to 50 KPH from south of the Mosston school zone. (refer previous submission).
- 3) Montgomery commences from the 50 KPH restricted State Highway and has a 70 KPH restriction which is now proposed to be reduced to 60 KPH. Why not just keep the entry speed at 50 KPH through to the confluence. If not a 50 KPH restriction be applied to this road prior to entering the confluence.
- 4) Springvale. I agree with the proposal to remove the 70KPH restriction from between Cathro Lane and Caversham Road.
- 5) Caversham. If the above items are endorsed by Council, Caversham will be 50 KPH by default

If the above can be achieved I believe it will be easier to implement and understand by road users.

This submission is made on behalf of Mainstreet Wanganui Inc (Mainstreet) and has been prepared by The Mainstreet Executive represented by Peter Robinson, Chair and Amanda Gibbons, General Manager.

This organisation represents all businesses located within the Central Business District (CBD) of Wanganui and property owners.

We also have a wider community interest in maintaining a safe and attractive Town Centre for the benefit of our citizens and visitors.

This organisation currently manages maintenance in the Wanganui CBD A and CBD B precinct, under a Service Level Agreement with Wanganui District Council.


We request the following points and statement be added as part of the 2017 Speed & Traffic Bylaw

The Town Centre traffic must be directed as to how to drive through the precinct. These are unsafe intersections and the fact that there isn't a known speed limit and signage all hinder the natural and safe flow of the mixture of vehicle and foot traffic.

Mainstreet Whanganui would like to make it known that we do not support the precinct being made a pedestrian only zone as this would damage shopping and eating precincts. However as it is a shopping, eating and services district it has people on foot or using other means of transport in conjunction with parking their vehicles.

It needs to be a safe and foot traffic friendly zone where vehicles are present but are secondary to pedestrian paced activity.

1. Replace lights with Round-a-bout at Victoria Avenue/Guyton Street intersection. Add speed humps at the top and bottom of Guyton Street.



Mainstreet Whanganui has consulted with its Guyton Street, Block Four and upper Block Three members, traffic police, ambulance driver, various 1st floor tenants in this area and random members of the public who unanimously support this change.

It is our view that the Town Centre "spine" (Victoria Avenue between Ingestre Street and Taupo Quay) achieves a good

pedestrian and leisure friendly environment which is hindered by the Guyton Street connection where there are traffic lights rather than the preferred alternative of a round-a-bout with crossings similar to the Ridgway Street/Victoria Avenue. The lights do not calm traffic flows but create a stop/start situation.

We would like to advocate placement of speed humps at the top of Guyton Street (between Paiges Book Gallery and Strath Davis Furniture) and lower Guyton Street (between Wanganui Chronicle and the Grand Hotel). This model mirrors the Ridgway street/Victoria Avenue and Maria Place/Victoria Ave situation which we consider work very well.

Local businesses report near misses, incidents and accidents that occur in this area knowing that this could be easily avoided by fixing the way that traffic, cyclists and pedestrians flow through these intersections.

When enquiring with our members about these areas it was stated by at least ¼ of the Guyton Street businesses that there is going to be a fatality at the top intersection because of the accidents they witness and attend on an average of one every two weeks – most of which are not reported to police or go directly through insurance.

Members commented that that drivers accelerate in and out of the intersection in Guyton Street between Victoria Avenue and Wicksteed/Watt Streets to speed up to catch the lights or speed up the hill making it difficult for vehicles coming out of either Wicksteed or Watt Streets.

In a 15 minute period between 12.15pm – 12.30pm, one of our staff members counted 16 jaywalkers, 11 of which walked in front of turning traffic. They saw three vehicles that were turning right from Victoria Avenue get stuck in the middle of the road on a red light. This resulted in one of the vehicles being in the middle of the road as the pedestrian crossing buzzer sounded meaning the vehicle had to leave the intersection through pedestrians on a red light! This is a safety issue and must be addressed

All businesses said that there is no way that they could see this change in the intersection affecting their business in a negative way and some even commented that they felt it may encourage people to walk past the intersection and into their business.

2. Speed Restriction

We ask Council to reinstate the proposal of 30km/hr speed restriction, or at the very least create a Courteous Zone of a recommended 30Km/hr, for Victoria Avenue, Ridgway Street, Maria Place and Guyton Street in the parts bounded by Taupo Quay, Drews Avenue/Watt Street/Wicksteed Street, Ingestre Street and St Hill Street.

This supports all points, making drivers aware that they are moving into a pedestrian friendly zone. Drivers behave differently when they understand they are in a "slow zone" and are cautious

of their surroundings even more so than when in a regular 50km/hr zone. This can only improve the safety aspects spoken above.

3. Signage

Mainstreet Whanganui would like Council to allocate funds from its traffic budget and involve our Design & Heritage committee in the design and reinstatement of good Town Centre signage. Signage became an issue when years back the Victoria Ave/Taupo Quay and Victoria Ave/Ingestre Street intersection lighting changed meaning that signage was no longer able to be placed in the

designated spaces due to the fact that it could obstruct the intersection lights. This has resulted in there being no "Welcome" signage at the entrance to the Town Centre Precinct: just a sign stating

"Metered parking ahead"

We would like the links from the St Hill Street pathway/cycleway to include directional and historical signage and a plan to make the walkways and linkages (Maria Place and Oriental Toilets) safer and more inviting for users. The vision points of this strategy are not simply to get from one side of Whanganui to the other but for people to enjoy their journey along the way

We need to encourage people to stop, rest and take in the sights before continuing on their journey.

Summary:

Mainstreet Whanganui requests that the Guyton Street changes are prioritised in the 2017/18 budget as we cannot see this being an expensive task but a long lasting one. This is a safety risk with a relatively simple solution.

Mainstreet Whanganui would like to offer their services to help achieve our requested outcomes.

Comment from Whanganui Police:

Hello Amanda

Police will be forwarding submissions regarding the changes being proposed. In response the points you've highlighted I have simplified them as below.

Over the past <u>two years</u> there have been a total of 14 1Vs (vehicle crashes) recorded at or near those intersections.

- Nine of these crashes were at or near Guyton and Victoria Avenue.
- While five were at Guyton and Wicksteed. (Four 1Vs at Guyton and Wicksteed were actually at the intersection itself, while those on Victoria and Guyton are often involving vehicles reversing out of carparks and driveway and were near to the intersection.)

The hot day for motor vehicle crashes at these intersections is Thursday and they usually occurred between 10am and 1pm.

I think the suggestions you have made in relation to the intersections will make these roads safer i.e. roundabout and speed hump (due to visibility being limited and the change in elevation on both sides of this intersection).

Comment from Whanganui Fire Brigade

A) What are your thoughts on what Mainstreet proposes?

As long as the round a bout is mountable, like the Watt Fountain, that will be fine to get our trucks around. Guyton Street is a main thoroughfare to Aramoho of the Lower CBD but won't affect the truck going through as we have to move slowly (10km/hr) through the area anyway. Double lanes make it easy to get through the intersection and I would see it as a problem if this is reduced to a single lane, however, if need-be, we would probably just use a different route but that is only likely if additions, like flower beds in the middle of the street were added to the crossings like at Ridgway Street

- B) Do you know of any accidents or near misses that have happened at this intersection? *Nope*
- C) Will the change affect your business in comparison to the current road layout? Why? Flowerbeds and raised pedestrian crossing could be an issue. Not convinced pedestrian crossings by a roundabout is best on an intersection, however this could be combatted by moving Vic Ave crossings further away from intersection.

Comment from two Whanganui Ambulance Drivers

A) What are your thoughts on what Mainstreet proposes?

Driver One: Really like the idea personally. It doesn't matter what you do with the road, it can change anytime and for any reason. Emergency services will find a way to get to where they have to go.

Driver Two: Personally like it but this is the main thoroughfare and may slow it down. May have complications to access urgent work in the area, or could slow it down to get to the City – River – Dublin Street area.

Proposed Whanganui Traffic and Speed Bylaw 2017

Dear Sir/Madam

Thank you for the opportunity to submit on the proposed Traffic and Speed Bylaw. The New Zealand Transport Agency (the Transport Agency) is a Crown entity established by the Land Transport Management Act 2003 (LTMA). The Transport Agency's statutory objective is to undertake its functions in a way that contributes to an effective, efficient, and safe land transport system in the public interest.

The Transport Agency has a mandate under the LTMA, the Government Roading Powers Act 1989, and the Government Policy Statement on Land Transport to carry out its functions in a way that delivers the transport outcomes set by the Government. These outcomes are:

- Addresses current and future demand for access to economic and social opportunities
- Provides appropriate transport choices
- Is resilient
- Is a safe system, increasingly free of death and serious injury
- Mitigates the effects of land transport on the environment
- Delivers the right infrastructure and services to the right level at the best cost

The Transport Agency has recently introduced the *Speed Management Guide* (the Guide) designed to help Road Controlling Authorities determine objective road risk and appropriate approaches to address that risk. The core principles of the Guide are to create national consistency and good community engagement and understanding in the setting of speed limits with the aim of helping New Zealanders choose the right speed for the road.

Overall, the Transport Agency supports the proposed changes outlined in the Statement of Proposal. However as a general comment the Transport Agency is encouraging all Road Controlling Authorities to review the speed limits based on the principles outlined in the Guide. While the approaches outlined in the Guide have not been used in the current review, the Transport Agency encourages collaboration with WDC in future speed bylaw reviews.

The table below summarises the locations of the proposed changes from the Statement of Proposal and our comments. Following the table are comments for those locations where we have specific comments for consideration and for those that we do not support.

Comments on specific locations

The following comments use the site location numbers as the table above.

12. Whanganui River Road (proposed 80 kilometres per hour speed limit)

The Transport Agency supports the proposal to reduce the speed limit on Whanganui River Road from the existing 100km/h limit as this will support the inclusion of the Mountain to Sea Cycleway in the New Zealand Cycle Trails. Furthermore, the proposed speed reduction is in line with the Guide as Whanganui River Road is recommended as a priority intervention for a reduced speed limit to 80km/h. The Agency does request that consideration of a reduced speed limit through Jerusalem (Ranana) to 50km/h also be considered.

14. Heads Road (proposed 60 kilometres per hour speed limit between Beach Road and Raupo Street)

The Transport Agency does not support the increase in speed limit to 60km/h on this section of Heads Road. The Speed Management Guide has not identified Heads Road as an area for a potential speed increase. This is further emphasised as there is no empirical evidence to justify a speed increase. Based on GPS data, the current operating speed is between 40-44km/h which implies no great demand for a higher speed.

Furthermore the speed management maps provided to WDC recommended the safe and appropriate speed to be 50km/h. The Transport Agency would also be concerned that raising the speed limit could result in a shift in the speed distribution curve overall and that some drivers (85th percentile) will drive at 70km/h rather than 60km/h. The result of this change could be an increase in severity of crashes due to speed.

It also fails to pass the test under the Speed Management Guide for a 60km/h speed limit in an urban area as Heads Road is neither a One Network Road Classification (ONRC) class 1 or 2 road.

MY husband an I have a sporthorse breeding and training business which dates back to 1978. Over the last decade the farming properties (old Trillo Estate) and other large pieces of land have been subdivided into 1 ha lots. From the originally 6 houses on the Kaikokopu Road (Blueskin Rd to the end of Kaikokopu Rd Lithgow Farm house) there are now 36 houses ... letterbox after letterbox! On the stretch from the Lithgow Farm house {tar sealed straight road to inter section Blueskin Rd} the traffic is speeding up significantly after the winding metal stretch down from Aramoho. I personally feel absolutely intimidated by the high speed of actually 'non resident' drivers on Kaikokopu Road. Some speeds are well above 100 km/h and are absolutely dangerous to our business and using the long acre for riding as well!

In my opinion the Kaikokopu Road from Lithgow farm hose to the intersection Blueskin Road should be limited to 60 km/h. There are lots of small children now living in the new houses and they have to walk along Kaikokopu Road to the School bus stop at the intersection Blueskin Road. The kids stand on a small grass verge and have cars racing past them at 100 km plus on the Blueskin Road. The Blueskin Road should also be speed limited from the Railway bridge to just past the entrance way to Bristol property.

There are no footpaths for pedestrians to work along and the kids walking down to the bus stop have to contend with idiots screaming along the road flicking gravel into them that hurts!! I imagine there are many other rural roads like this.

I have enclosed noise readings for your interest. They have been charges from the first readings , due in part to traffic nix, extensive plantings and fencing we have added.

My husband Hugh and I reside at 198 Great North Road in between the 70 k zone and the 100k zone. Our home was extensively renovated in 2008.

The walls insulated with Airfoam, underfloor with Expole, and roof space with batts. All West and North facing windows were double glazed with Hush Glass and East facing windows double glazed.

Despite our best endeavors we are subjected to excessive road noise. The major reasons are speed, heavy vehicles and also vibration.

In the past year, the addition of the new milk treatment station has added to the discomfort particularly in the early hours of the morning.

Discussion with immediate neighbours has led my husband and I to make the following suggestions:

- a: The speed limit be reduced to a 50k zone ending past the Double S Motordrome.
 - This would allow the traffic from Pickwick Road to merge more safely with traffic on the Great North Road. The area has undergone major development in recent years and residents are finding egress onto the State Highway at times a hair raising experience due to the excessive speed of city bound traffic.
- b: That a a heavy vehicle bypass through the industrial zone with egress from Rapanui Road onto State Highway 3 be considered. This particular junction not only gives excellent visibility to the driver but is generously proportioned thus allowing ease of turning for trucks and tankers merging with other traffic.

We have timed this route from the railway line at the intersection of Heads Road and Gilbert St to Mosston Road. Down Mosston Road to Tayforth Road, then to Francis Road into Rapuni Road and onto the Great North Road at the Double S Motordrome. This took all of 15 minutes. The route is not intensively developed being largely semi rural nor does it have a heavy volume of traffic.

Below are noise level readings I have taken over a period of weeks. They are well above World Health standards. Anything over 55 decibels is considered hazardous to health. You will note that those taken outside are the highest and make any thought of summer outdoor entertaining an impossibility.

Sadly I have recently lost a valuable antique plate that fell from a shelf in the kitchen cupboard due to road vibration. My husband has had equipment fall from the shelves in his workshop.

At times it is difficult to determine whether we are having an earth quake or another speeding heavy vehicle is passing. The recent addition of mik tankers to the flotilla of heavy vehicles means a very early wakening call with little sleep after the hours of 5 a.m.



Re Airport Road

When driving to the airfield one comes off the main road around the roundabout (the one you can no longer see across) and enter a 50k zone.

Shortly down the road there is a 100k sign, this should be (in my opinion) about 100metres further out towards the airfield and in my opinion 80k.

However, we are now doing 100k past side roads and houses, and then up the hill, further on there is a sign warning of trucks crossing the road and around the corner there is the side road on the left and opposite a café sign on the right, in the shade of the trees, drawing the drivers attention away from the side road, A few metres further on on the left, there is a long open well-lit strip of grass that would be ideal for this sign.

A little further on and around another bend and still at a 100k there is a 30k sign for the terminal building parking, an earlier warning before this would be advisable. Or shift the sign to make it visible prior to the bend.

I feel that all these factors should be looked at promptly.

In making this submission I have the following comments for your consideration and further dialogue as you see fit. I wish to be heard.

The comments are made in good faith and are my own views. It may be that I have overlooked some matters which will no doubt become obvious in the reading should that be the case.

Introduction and Philosophy for the Bylaw.

- 1. As I understand it, the form of the Bylaw has taken the existing *Traffic Bylaw 2011* and *Speed Limits Bylaw 2008*, unpacked them into two new bylaws by separating out the parking, stopping and standing of vehicles etc, from the other activities generated by 'traffic' as it moves about the road network. There is no reason given for this departure and is a move that I recommend against.
- 2. It is important that all of the activities (relating to Roads and Traffic) remain under a singular instrument of control (bylaw) and management, since one activity by a vehicle in its use of that Road, is usually the consequence of another. For example, banning a U-turn, could well result in enabling the reinstatement of parking nearby, which under the previous bylaw would be easy to encapsulate and ratify. It would now require resolutions across two bylaws each to do with the movement of vehicles.
- 3. This is not the only reason for a single bylaw.
- 4. Any bylaw should be purely to stipulate the 'requirements' Council has set, and in this case would be for the control traffic (which includes stopping, standing and parking) in respect of roads under the control of Council. This is also a reflection of the way in which the Statues apply to our road rules. Even the Road Code has a summary of the Rules relating to say lane usage, no stopping lines, the meaning of signs etc all in the one book. There is no volume 1 for *some* activities, and a volume 2 for *other* activities motorists should know about.
- 5. Secondly the implant of specific 'declarations' relating to speed changes in this Bylaw (Cl 15) are thought to be inappropriate. When setting a proposed speed a local authority is required to make a bylaw in respect of those changes pursuant to clause 2.5(1) of the proposed Land Transport (yellow paper) *Setting of Speed Limits Rule 2017*.
- 6. A separate bylaw relating to specific speed limits would be more in line with the procedures, clearer, not as an intrinsic part of a bylaw pertaining to other controls.
- 7. The legal processes for making changes to a bylaw are quite cumbersome (for good reason) and therefore more difficult to make changes. As already stated, the (Traffic etc) bylaw should quite simply be the 'instrument' through which to make any changes by 'resolution' of Council and these resolutions then would be collated to form part of the 'supporting schedules' to which the public can refer, or others as the case may be. Collated as in e.g. no stopping, Taxi Stands, U-turns, one-way etc. making it and easy for reference for making further changes at locations as necessary.

- 8. A first impression upon reading the proposal for this Bylaw, was initially interpreted as a being a means to 'lock down' speed limits on certain roads in the District ahead of the due data findings that are evolving from the imminent Land Transport *Setting of Speed Limits Rule 2017* to replace the current 2003 legislation.
- 9. A further point is to the application of the bylaw. It does not differentiate between roads under the control of Council and others. For example many roads are under the control of and funded by the NZTA (kerb to kerb). Any delegations or other arrangements relating to this should be expressed in the opening part of any bylaw relating to Roads in the District.
- 10. It is thought that the purpose (clause 4) of the bylaw is too light and is more of an objective "to enhance and promote a safe and efficient network". This rhetoric already appears in other programmes, legislation, policy statements et al, whereas the writer believes instead of a slogan, the purpose is "... to set requirements for the control of traffic and parking in respect of Roads, parking places, transport stations owned or under the control or Council" or some such. It has to be safe and efficient, else why do anything.

Summary of above;

- 11. The (Traffic etc) Bylaw should be all encompassing for the Districts Roads and Traffic as a single 'one stop shop' bylaw.
- 12. The setting of speed limits should be a separate bylaw in accordance with the procedures *Setting of Speed Limits Rule 2017.*
- 13. Restrictions and controls applied to Roads by resolution should not be part of the bylaw as such, but retained as part of the supporting schedules comprised of locations and places affected by changes made through the Bylaw.
- 14. The issues of application require expressing in terms of delegations should they exist.
- 15. The 'purpose' of the bylaw is wanting and is not definitive.

Other Observations:

- 16. It is suggested Clause 5, <u>Interpretation</u>, could make reference to the meanings within the Land Transport Act, Land Transport Road User Rule 2004 or others where definitions are not covered in this list. For example Road could be covered by referring to the Land Transport Act 1998 (more current), avoiding the actual narrative.
- 17. Similarly it is important to include the meaning 'Roadway' [Land Transport (Road User) Rule 2004] since to it referred to throughout and invariably misused by many. This would apply to other terms used frequently in any bylaw.
- 18. <u>Cycle, cycle lane, cycle path</u> could all be referred to as having the same meaning as in the Land Transport (Road User) Rule 2004.
- 19. Clause 6 as an example, the laying out of Council process regarding resolutions, to include public notification of 14 days, written objections etc is repeated in similar context in several place. The writer is

wondering if this is necessary given these are Council procedures and are covered elsewhere in policy documents and legislation that could be covered off in a reference or stated at the outset. The other context referred to is the listing of the considerations Council must undertake before making a resolution. It seems a little strange to put this into a bylaw.

- 20. Yet, there is little mention if any of the need for "Council shall erect signs on the roads described on the resolutions...." which is an absolute must for engine braking, other zones etc. in accordance with the Statutes.
- 21. Clause 9 uses the terms 'specified class of traffic' not sure what this could mean. Class of vehicle is straight forward enough. If this clause is meant to apply to loading zones, bus stops and taxi stands it should say so, or if it is also about heavy vehicle restrictions, a separate clause should be considered.
- 22. Clause 10, the provision of Special Vehicle Lanes should include the usage as being "restricted either permanently or for any set periods of time..."
- 23. For the movement of vehicles by size, consideration needs to be given to the driving of High Productivity Motor Vehicles on any roads not authorised.
- 24. Clause 12, Engine Breaking... no comment but if it's broke, needs fixing.
- 25. Clause 14 (2) refers to the 'types and locations of Roads..." There is no mention what a road 'type' means?
- 26. The only comments to make on the proposed speed changes on specific streets are, that, Council having agreed to the speed limit proposals, does not mean they belong in this in this bylaw, And, some appear to be out of place and context.
- 27. The writer is not convinced at this early stage whether the procedures outlined when an RCA decision is to set or review speed limits is fully based on the Speed Management Guide.
- 28. In deference, the writer is assuming the data in the form of speed management information is not yet available from NZTA, in which case these proposals may be premature. Instead it seems the use of 'safety' is employed to slow things down, and 'efficiency ' to speed things up such as on Heads Road without real data.

General

- 29. There is still work to be done, especially to tighten down the wording which presently leaves too much room for interpretation. It should be simple and clear. Thank you for this opportunity. Having left this a little late I am afraid the commentary is less comprehensive than intended.
- 30. Please note I would be grateful for the opportunity to be heard or further provide clarification on any of the points above in which I would be willing to have further engagement.

service vehicles. Being only 6 metres wide, there is very little room on the verges for pedestrians and no room

for cyclists when two of these vehicles meet. In some places the ability to move off the verge is also very restricted. We feel that, as your transport plan emphasises promoting cycling and walking areas, the slower speed should be taken into consideration.

We believe a 50kph restriction should apply from Great North Road to the wider Mosston Road. This should slow vehicles passing the busy but dangerous entry/exit to Chrystal Valley water, past Sandy Lane and Sandcroft Drive intersections where vision is restricted.

Replacing the Pukeko sign near Chrystal Valley water with a vehicle turning warning would also seem warranted.

Dear Sir,

In March 2015, we moved to our current home at 38a Montgomery Road. Four or five times a week, my wife and I undertake recreational walks in our neighbourhood which start and finish at our driveway.

Approximately 6 months ago, much needed clearing of roadside growth on our road particularly near Sandcroft Drive was undertaken, plus scraping of vegetation along both verges of Montgomery Road. Whilst this initially made it easier to walk along the road and to move away from the road edges when traffic approached, vegetation has now returned. Between the driveway of number 32 and Sandcroft Drive there are many poplar tree suckers plus other fast growing rubbish growing which now makes it difficult to move safely and quickly off the road edge.

The current speed limit for our road is 70kph. Since the clearing work was done, we believe that vehicle speed has increased due to the improved vision now available. Montgomery Road is 6 metres wide compared to Mosston Road's 7 metres. Dual milk tankers, stock trucks and trailers plus logging trucks travelling to and from Great North Road and Heads Road are regular users of Montgomery Road together with other large vehicles servicing Heads Road industrial businesses.

When large vehicles meet there is little margin available for them let alone the frequent pedestrians, runners or cyclists who use this route.

A head on crash occurred early in February between Sandy Lane and Sandcroft Drive and a vehicle left the road and took out the Sandcroft Drive sign a few days ago. There been other non-injury crashes in the past.

There was also a fatal pedestrian crash in the last ten year window. The road remains unchanged following this despite earlier community requests for a combined safety foot / cycle path.

There are 8 or 9 residential sections for sale in our area which in time is likely to increase pedestrian/vehicle movement from Montgomery Road properties. There is also planning being done for the development of the Castlecliff Port which could result in even greater use being made of the Montgomery/Mosston route by a wider range of vehicles.

Crystal Valley Water operate from a Montgomery Road property where access is opposite Sandy Lane. Vehicles travelling from Great North Road are required to undertake a very

sharp and blind left turn into this property which often leads to overlapping of the centre line to complete the turn. This creates a hazard for other road users. From our observation this is a very busy business with a steady flow of vehicles but there are no signs warning of turning traffic but there is a warning sign for, of all things, Pukeko. We've never seen a Pukeko on the road since moving here.

Recommendation

- Due to pedestrian numbers and the volume of large vehicles already using this narrow road, we believe consideration should urgently be given to a reduced speed limit of 50km for the entire Montgomery Road.
- That Montgomery Road be included in the current walking and cycling strategy and be urgently moved forward in this ten year programme. Perhaps funds from the Development Contributions levied on section developers could be put towards this cost.
- That urgent attention be paid to removing vegetation regrowth particularly between Sandcroft Drive and number 32 Montgomery Road and other areas. (since activated)

Also the shrubs by the road side on the property next to ours, I believe, are on the road reserve and not on the adjacent property. This vegetation obscures our view of the road when leaving and entering our property and in my opinion they should be removed.

Hi Ron and Lyn, I agree with your comments about our road. Traffic often goes down at more than 70kmph which is dangerous for those walking along the road. I often walk my dog down our road and the vegetation since the clearing of it a while back is needing attention again. If the speed limit is to remain at 70kmph then people need to adhere to this and not travel faster.

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Hi Ron,

Yes I agree with all of your comments. I believe widening of the Road should be scheduled if the road continues to be the link between the highways north and south. Is was never intended to be used as that, hence the narrower width.

Although the speed limit is 70 kph, this is frequently exceeded by young drivers and others.

I have personally ceased riding a cycle on the road due to the narrow margins available when two heavy vehicles pass.

Exiting our gateway at 29 is very risky due to vision, but added to that the risk of a speeding vehicle approaching from the RHS makes it a challenge to cross the road before being struck.

Vegetation on the berm is a significant cost to us for mowing and spraying and I agree that the local authority should do more to contribute to this, particularly when it has an effect on the safety of residents.

WHANGANUI DISTRICT COUNCIL - TRAFFIC AND SPEED BYLAW REVIEW 2017

Thank you for the opportunity to support your review of the speed limits for the Whanganui River Road.

Ruapehu District Council shares approximately 7km of the road from the WDC boundary to Pipiriki through a very narrow section of this route. It is understood that Whanganui District Council is reviewing its setting of speed limits under the new guide and draft Speed Limits Rule, this will in turn inform the new bylaws once the rule is formally adopted and no longer in draft. It is likely that changes to the draft Rule will be superficial in nature and not affect the bylaw. However this is our opportunity to determine an appropriate speed limit for Whanganui River Road within the Ruapehu District as well, and to use this as a basis for discussions with WDC.

Setting of Speed Limits

The new Speed Limits Guide has the aim of setting nationally consistent speed limits that are safe and appropriate. The Transport Agency 'must' supply information of the safe and appropriate speed for any road requested by Council, but only if that information is available. Setting of Speed Limits under the new guidelines takes account of the One Network Road Classification, road function, design, safety, use, alignment, width, hazards, intersection and access density bylaws.

Whanganui River Road - Speed Limit Assessment

The unmarked Secondary Collector road follows a tortuous alignment with severe or vertical dropoffs into the river below, has a lane width of < 3.0m each direction and services the forestry, farmlands and communities of Pipiriki, Jerusalem and Ranana. The road forms part of the Mountains to the sea cycle trail and is seeing an increasing number of cyclists. Further, it is part of a tourist trail with a number of campervans, tourist drivers and Te Araroa Walkway users.

The road from Pipiriki to the RDC boundary (and on to Jerusalem) has:

- Current speed limit of 100 km/h
- Assessed safe and appropriate speed of <80km/h using Table 2.2 below and as indicated on the Speed Management Framework Map
- Operating speed 35km/h
- Road Stereotype is sealed, single-lane, two way undivided (off scale, assessed as two lane)
- Alignment is tortuous: The road is tortuous with consecutive curves and numerous sharp

(with typical radii of 350m to 500m) and very sharp curves (with typical radii <350m), and can generally be driven at less than 75km/hr.

- Carriageway width is narrow: <6m width, both directions
- **Shoulder width** is **narrow**: Very narrow with little or no shoulder, <0.5m, is generally present
- Road hazard risk is severe with steep drops into river valley, 'aggressive' vertical faces and 20+ non-frangible hazards per kilometre within 5m of seal edge
- Land use is remote rural
- Low intersection density
- Low access density
- Traffic Volume Low <1000 v/day (50 veh/day)
- Assessed ONRC before moderation Access Low Volume, after moderation Secondary Collector
- Infrastructure Risk Rating is high (both automatically assessed and manual calculation)
- Increasing number of vulnerable road users, including cyclists and walkers on recognised route.

Appropriate Speed Limit: 60km/h

However, given the severe drop-offs, tortuous alignment, vulnerable road users and single lane status an even lower limit could be justified and implemented.

Ruapehu District Council recommends further consideration of a speed limit of 60km/h from Jerusalem north, or alternatively complete an assessment of the route between Jerusalem and Pipiriki as a cross boundary road. Whanganui River Road from Jerusalem to RDC boundary was not formally assessed, however the result is likely similar; a 60km/h limit. Jerusalem to SH4 may be justified as 80km/h, however a review of Street View would suggest at least some sections are narrow and suited to a lower limit:

PROPOSED TRAFFIC AND SPEED BYLAW 2017

- 1. This submission is made by the Wanganui District Council of the New Zealand Automobile Association ("AA") on behalf of its 20,000+ members that it has in this region.
- 2. I **attach** a copy of a letter that was sent to Rui Leitao the Roading Manager for the Whanganui District Council on the 28th of June 2017. My understanding from speaking with Rui is that he did not receive that letter.
- 3. Accordingly a meeting hasn't occurred which is concerning for AA.
- 4. As a result a formal submission needs to be made and the following points are for your consideration:
 - 4.1 The AA is concerned about the lack of detailed consultation on the proposed bylaw. We initially learnt about these proposals via an article in the *Wanganui Chronicle*, and were disappointed AA Wanganui was not consulted directly as a key stakeholder (although the material was subsequently provided to our head office).
 - 4.2 The AA is particularly concerned that the proposed bylaw may not comply with the Setting of Speed Limits Rule (2003), specifically the calculation of speed limits under the Speed Limits New Zealand (SLNZ) guidelines (Schedule 1).

- 4.3 In particular, the bylaw consultation material does not provide data on the mean and 85th percentile speeds on the roads in question, and whether the proposed speeds comply with the guidelines in Table SLNZ3 of the Rule (section 3.4).
- 4.4 Nor is any data provided on crashes, or a crash rate comparison against national data, as required under section 3.5 of SLNZ.
- 4.5 In the absence of this data it is difficult for the AA to provide meaningful feedback.
- 4.6 The proposed bylaw notes that the speed limits are being reviewed in response to the new Speed Management Guide (SMG), which ultimately replaces SLNZ (when enabled by a new Speed Limits Rule to be enacted later this year). Yet none of the data and 'heat maps' provided by NZTA under the SMG process have been provided to support the proposals, nor whether the roads in question fall into the top 5% or 10% of WDC roads with speed-related crash risk for prioritisation. Nor is it clear whether reducing speeds is the appropriate treatment, or, as the SMG requires, if other engineering treatments have also been considered.
- 4.7 It is the AA's (and NZTA's) expectation that RCA's will already be applying the SMG when reviewing speed limits, but it is unclear whether this process has been applied to the proposed bylaw.
- 4.8 NZTA have been providing regional workshops for RCA's to understand the SMG, and the AA districts have also been involved in that process to learn how to interpret the data and 'heat maps'. As a result, the NZTA expect the RCA's will make this information available to the local AA district as part of any review (preferably before public consultation).
- 4.9 We have requested a meeting with the WDC to review the data provided by NZTA and where these roads rank in terms of priority, and we would also like to understand whether the WDC has investigated other engineering treatments.
- 4.10 Therefore, due to the absence of information and evidential data in the bylaw consultation material, it is not possible for AA to provide an informed submission on the specific proposed speed limit changes at this time.
- 4.11 The AA has other concerns with the proposed Traffic and Speed Bylaw 2017 and its consultation, but in summary we do not believe that the proposed bylaw can proceed and therefore we suggest it should be withdrawn.

- 4.12 We note that the existing Traffic Bylaw does not expire until April 2018, while the speed limits remain in force until revoked. There is no urgency to review speed limits following the introduction of the SMG to align them with the recommended speeds in the SMG or according to the One Network Road Classification. The existing speed limits remain valid until RCAs choose to review them and the SMG highlights those roads that should be a priority based on speed-related risk.
- 4.13 Withdrawing the bylaw would enable a more detailed review of the roads under the SMG process, and enable the WDC to consult in more detail with key stakeholders, including the AA, to reach a consensus view on proposed treatments and revised speed limits, before issuing an amended bylaw for public consultation.
- For the above reasons we believe it would be unsafe for the WDC to proceed any further with this proposed bylaw and that in respect of the suggested changes to speed limits you need to go back to the start and follow a correct process.
- Given the deadline for consultation on the proposed bylaw, and the many concerns the AA has with the proposals, we request an urgent meeting with the WDC to agree on a process to resolve these matters and to review the proposed speed limits and various related data in order that we can provide meaningful and informed feedback.
- The AA have also raised this with our head office, who will take this up with the NZTA and ask them to engage directly with the WDC on why it does not seem to have applied the SMG in this proposed bylaw, which NZTA is assisting RCAs to do.
- 5. In light of that we would encourage a re-assessment of where you are at in the process and if we can be of help we would meet with you to discuss this further. Should you choose not to take that course and proceed to present submissions to the Councillors we require the opportunity to speak to our submission.
- 6. A copy of this letter is being sent to Rui Leitao and Kym Fell for their information.

- We have received notification of the Proposed Traffic and Speed Bylaw 2017 via our head office on 13 June 2017 and only to our Wanganui Office on 19 June 2017 after your intervention.
- 2. We were surprised to first learn about these proposals a fortnight ago via an article in the Wanganui Chronicle. Thank you for subsequently notifying the AA directly but can I ask that any future notifications be sent to AA Wanganui, PO Box 440 Wanganui, or email the District Manager Belinda Darragh on BDarragh@aa.co.nz.
- 3. You will be aware of the release of the new Speed Management Guide, and NZTA's and the AA's expectation is that speed limit reviews will be undertaken using this new process. Therefore we are concerned that the consultation does not provide any of the evidential material available under the Speed Management Guide to justify the suggested new speed limits, or to help determine whether the roads in question are a priority for speed limit reviews or engineering treatments.
- 4. AA Wanganui would like to meet with you to discuss these proposals and to review the relevant data for those roads under the Speed Management Guide in order to help us compose a submission on these proposals.
