As the largest, longest-running and most diverse artist trail in New Zealand,

this year's event celebrates 21 years of art discovery in Whanganui. An eclectic multimedia showcase of local talent, hundreds of artists will open their doors and share their unique craft over the two weekends. Also scheduled during the two weekends are workshops and entertainment events including an Artist's Palate progressive dinner experience, and a "look behind the scenes" at Sarjeant on the Quay.

Shared pathway works

First stage of Whanganui East project

Work has started on the first stage of the Whanganui East shared pathway project. The work involves the conversion of an unsealed pathway on top of the stopbanks through Kowhai Park - from opposite Georgetti Road to the park's playground entrance facing Nile Street - to a mostly three-metre wide concrete path.

The total work for this section of the project is expected to take about five weeks. Although sections of the existing unsealed pathway will be closed at times, pedestrians and cyclists will still be able to use the existing Kowhai Park roadway. Alternatively, pedestrians can also use the footpath along Anzac Parade.
