Gravel area of Mill Rd

Planned closure January-April 2020

The gravel section of Mill Road from the intersection of Rakau Road and Mill Road to the intersection of Manuka Street and Mill Road will be closed from Wednesday. 8 January 2020 until Friday, 3 April 2020 to enable contractors to reconstruct and finish the surface of the road. Once completed the fully-sealed road will provide extra access from the Mill Road commercial zone to and from Castlecliff. Both Manuka Street and Rakau Road will remain open at all times for businesses and residents during the construction, and the only section of road closed during this time will be the current gravel section

Tree removal

Sarjeant Gallery Redevelopment project site

Several trees will be removed from the Sarjeant Gallery Redevelopment site in Pukemanu Queen's Park during January 2020. The trees affected are a small stand of oaks and phoenix palms located in the building site area behind the gallery building. The trees are not protected, or listed as having any specific heritage value. Timber from the oaks will be milled and, depending on the quantity and quality obtained, may be able to be incorporated into the redevelopment.
