"We plan to be out and about in the community talking to people about the draft plan and hearing their views on options for Whanganui.

"We'll be asking for input on the future of the Whanganui Velodrome, investment in spaces and places for young people including a possible youth hub, an extension for the Davis Library and development of a coastal care plan," Mayor McDouall says.

"We're not necessarily looking for traditional contractors, but for people who are passionate about Whanganui and have a genuine interest in the heritage of the Durie Hill elevator.


"If you are good operators who can manage customerfacing service and back-of-house administration, we really want to hear from you."
