Whanganui's Mayors Taskforce for Jobs has exceeded expectations with 18 young people in the Whanganui district placed into work since February.

The nationwide central government-funded initiative is targeted primarily at young people aged 16-25 years old who are not in employment, education or training and are facing barriers in finding employment.

Whanganui Mayor, Andrew Tripe, signed up for Mayors Taskforce for Jobs in the first month of his mayoralty and is proud to support an initiative that is delivering great outcomes for locals.

"I regularly meet up for a conversation with young people who have been placed into employment through the Mayors Taskforce for Jobs and it's something I thoroughly enjoy," Mayor Andrew says. "It's heart-warming to hear how this programme is making such a positive impact in their lives and giving them a leg-up towards a better future. In addition, it is helping our local businesses in a tight job market."

Ministry of Health notice

Whanganui's drinking water is classified as plumbosolvent, which means some plumbing fittings have the potential to allow minute traces of metals to accumulate in water standing in the fittings for several hours. Although the health risk is small, the Ministry of Health recommends that you flush a mugful of water from your drinking water tap each morning before use to remove any metals that may have dissolved from the plumbing fittings. The Ministry of Health recommends this simple precaution for all households, including those on public and private water supplies.

Road closures next week

Section of Plymouth Street

A section of Plymouth Street between Harrison Street and Bell Street will be closed to all through traffic for three days from 7.00am on Monday, 31 July until 5.00pm on Wednesday, 2 August 2023 to allow Whanganui District Council contractors to install services to 40 Plymouth Street. Access for residents and emergency vehicles will not be affected, and detour signs will be displayed during the work period.
